

he National Education Policy, 2020 is meant to provide an overarching vision and comprehensive framework for both school and higher education across the country. Till now, It is only a policy, not a law; implementation of its proposals depends on further regulations by both states and the center as education is a concurrent subject. But if implemented effectively, the policy can help reshape the future of the workforce and help the emerging job seekers become more job-ready. Among the multiple elements of the policy, some are directly linked to employability. There is no doubt that with a better education system the chances of employment become better. Various surveys have suggested that most of the passing graduates don't feel ready for their first job and they always remain in the dilemma of staying or leaving the job. Freshers are not fully prepared for their working life and lack of proper education is one of the main reasons. Industry-Academia gap is probably the most discussed thing by employers and job seekers. With the new policy coming in picture, the school and college education will not only be seen as a facilitator of degree but it will be treated as a medium to build personality and it'll help the students in their holistic professional growth. In recent times the need for behavioral competencies like resilience, agility, innovation and adaptability in the workforce has increased. From hiring to performance reviews, these skills are always prioritized. The traditional education system lacked the focus on building such competencies but the new policy has increased the scope of learning beyond subject-matters and made learning these skills essential. Additionally, these essential skills also include vocational exposure and skills; digital literacy, coding, and computational thinking.



New Education Policy and Higher Education: An Assessment

he Union Cabinet of India approved the new National Education Policy 2020 (NEP) on July 29, 2020. The policy has been designed with a vision that it will touch the lives of every citizen of the country. The policy is a comprehensive framework for elementary education to higher education and vocational training in rural and urban India. The policy aims to transform India's education system by 2040. The NEP envisions a complete overhaul and re-energizing of the higher education system to overcome challenges that the higher education system faces today. The main thrust of NEP 2020 regarding higher education is to end the fragmentation of higher education by transforming higher education institutions into large multidisciplinary universities, colleges and HEI clusters or knowledge hubs, each of which will aim to have 3000 or more students. In addition, all multidisciplinary universities and colleges will seek to establish education departments besides carrying out cutting-edge research in various aspects of education. The policy also envisions the establishment of the National Research Foundation (NRF). The NRF will provide a reliable base of merit-based but equitable peer-reviewed research funding, helping develop a culture of research in the country through appropriate incentives. This paper, thus, is an attempt to understand the vision of the New Education Policy 2020 towards Higher Education.

Our country launched its last national education policy in 1986 and revised in 1992. During these 34 years, the world has witnessed unprecedented changes in every walk of life. Revolutionary changes in the world's political economy, triggered by technological developments, have made significant contribution to the demolishing of the barriers of gender, class, caste, culture, geographical distance, and so forth. A Rapid economic development after 1991, the year when India opened its economy for globalization, have triggered a high demand for knowledge and specialized skills. Recognizing the need to keep up with a rapidly changing world and knowledge landscape, a futuristic national education policy has been launched in our country on 29 July 2020. The chief purpose of the NEP is to reform the education system and bridge the gap between current learning outcomes and those desired.

Despite successivegovernmentpolicies framed for bridging gender and social category gaps in all levelseducation, largedisparities still remain, particularly for socio-economica wydisadvantaged groups that have been historically underrepresented in education. The present paper aims at highlighting the different hinderances faced by SEDGs and the steps proposed to be taken in the NEP 2020 for the upliftment of SEDGs. The NEP focuses on facilitating access from early childhood to higher education, integrating over two crore out-of-school children, and efforts towards socio-economically disadvantaged groups.

(OSGU and VCB hereinafter jointly referred to as the "Parties")

Preamble

WHEREAS OSGU and VCB have many areas of common interest, considerable advantage may be gained from their pursuit on a collaborative basis in the fields of academics, education, and research. NOW THEREFORE, OSGU and VCB have decided to enterintothis Memorandum of Understanding (hereinafter referred to as MoU), which defines the framework for the cooperation of the two institutions set out in the following sections.

Article 1 - Overall Objective

Both Institutes agree to develop the following collaborative activities in the academic areas of mutual interest, on a basis of equality and reciprocity.

The two institutions shall seek to promote:

The Institutions, shall collaborate with, each other, in the following fields for promotion of quality research work:

- Conduct conferences/workshops/seminars jointly where faculty members from the institutions would be encouraged to participate.
- Organise cultural exchange programmes and sports activities in both institutions.
- III. Jointly organize workshops on Massive Open Online Learning Courses (MOOC) and Information and Communication Technology (ICT).
- IV. Share library resources and provide access to laboratory facilities.
- V. Develop jointly new courses/programmes.
- VI. Carry out joint outreach and extension activities and capacitybuilding programmes for members of both the institutions and the local community.
- VII. Exchange information on teaching, learning material and other literature relevant to their educational and research programs,
- VIII. Jointly organize short-term continuing education programs on topics of mutual interest and to invite each other's faculty to participate therein,

Article 2 - Authorities and Responsibilities:

- I. Progress of this MoU will be monitored by Vice-Chancellor of OSGU and Principal of VCB, or their nominees through periodic meetings. Any change/modification/termination as introduced/suggested by the Review Committee (Comprising of authorised signatory of both the institutions, and such members as mutually decided upon by them) shall be accepted by both the institutions.
- II. However, for technical and administrative coordination purposes and day-to-day routine matters, the respective institutions may appoint/delegate the responsibility to designated coordinators.

Article- 3 Non-Discrimination

III. The parties agree not to discriminate on the basis of race, creed, national or ethnic origin, sex, age, handicap, political affiliation, disability or status as a veteran.

Article-4 Compliance with Law

The parties specifically intend to comply with all applicable laws, rules and regulations as they may be amended from time to time. If any part of this Agreement is determined to violate central, state, or local laws, rules, or regulations, the parties agree to negotiate in good faith revisions to any such provisions. If the parties fail to agree within a reasonable time to revisions required bringing the entire Agreement into compliance, either party may terminate this Agreement upon ninety days prior written notice to the other party.

Article-5 Force Majeure

In the event, students are unable to complete the Program due to but not limited to: acts of God; war; acts of the government; fires; floods; epidemics; quarantine restrictions; strikes, labour disputes or work stoppages; transportation contingency; and freight embargoes; other catastrophes or any similar occurrences beyond the reasonable control of both of the Universities, the initiator University will assist the affected students in finding an alternate site/mode to complete the Program.

Article-6 Intellectual Property Rights

The intellectual property rights (IPR) that arise as a result of joint research and collaborative activity under the agreement will be worked out on a case-to-case basis and will be consistent with officially laid down IPR policies of the two Universities

Article 7- Validity

The Memorandum shall remain in force for a period of FIVE years commencing from the effective date. Institutions may extend the term by written agreement signed by both after review.

Article 8 - Termination

Either institution may terminate the MoU by giving the other institution written notice of six months in advance. Once terminated, neither OSGU nor VCB will be responsible for any financial or otherwise losses the other institutions may suffer. However, OSGU and VCB will ensure that the provisions of this Memorandum shall continue to apply to all activities in progress until their completion.

Article 9- Amendments/Modifications

This MoU may be amended or modified by a written agreement signed by the representatives of both institutes.

Article-10 Dispute Resolution

The OSGU and VCB shall attempt to resolve all disputes arising out of or relating to this MOU by direct negotiation between them within reasonable time of arising of such dispute.

In case of any dispute between the both the parties to the agreement hereunto the same shall be liable to be challenged within the jurisdiction of the Place/District where the agreement, so has been signed and executed.







Preamble

WHEREAS IGU and VCB have many areas of common interest, considerable advantage may be gained from their pursuit on a collaborative basis in the fields of academics, education, and research. Article 1 - Overall Objective

- A. Faculty/Scientist/Staff/Student Exchange

B. Academic/Research Collaborations

The Institutions, shall collaborate with, each other, in the following fields for promotion of quality research work:

- Conduct conferences/workshops/seminars jointly where faculty members from the institutions would be encouraged to participate.
- Organise cultural exchange programmes and sports activities in both institutions.

- III. Jointly organize workshops on Massive Open Online Learning Courses (MOOC) and Information and Communication Technology (ICT).
- IV. Share library resources and provide access to laboratory facilities.
- V. Develop jointly new courses/programmes.
- VI. Carry out joint outreach and extension activities and capacitybuilding programmes for members of both the institutions and the local community.
- VII. Exchange information on teaching, learning material and other literature relevant to their educational and research programs,
- VIII. Jointly organize short-term continuing education programs on topics of mutual interest and to invite each other's faculty to participate therein,

Article 2 - Authorities and Responsibilities:

- I. Progress of this MoU will be monitored by Vice-Chancellor of IGU and Principal of VCB, or their nominees through periodic meetings. Any change/modification/termination as introduced/suggested by the Review Committee(Comprising of authorised signatory of both the institutions, and such members as mutually decided upon by them) shall be accepted by both the institutions.
- II. However, for technical and administrative coordination purposes and dayto-day routine matters, the respective institutions may appoint/delegate the responsibility to designated coordinators.

Article 3 - Validity
