ABOUT BHIWANI - *THE CHHOTI KASHI*

Bhiwani city, according to a legend, acquired its name from Bhani, the wife of a Rajput King- Maharaja Neempal Singh. The spelling changed to Bhiyani and subsequently to Bhiwani. Historically, Ain-e-Akbari also has references of Bhiwani, as it was one of the important centres of commerce during the Mughal period. Bhiwani is located at 28.78°N 76.13°E and has an average elevation of 225 metres. Bhiwani lies 285 kilometres from the state capital Chandigarh and 124 kilometres from the national capital Delhi. People of this region have extraordinary talents in sports and have represented Haryana at the national and international levels. The city has a conventional school of boxing, with almost all of the members of the Indian Boxing Squad coming from its nearby regions and has earned for itself the title of Mini Cuba. Bhiwani is also known as 'Chhoti Kashi' of India for having more than 300 temples. Some of the famous temples are Kirorimal temple, Star Temple, Devsar, Jogiwala mandir, and Khakhi Baba Mandir.

Bhiwani is a culturally and historically significant place. It boasts of so many important archaeological sites and is of perennial interest for the historians. 'Prithviraj Ki Kutchehari' is a place of historical testimony. The famous Rajput ruler Prithviraj Chauhan used to hold his court at this place. Another monument is the fort of Loharu. Among archaeological sites, Mitathal, a village situated about 12 kilometres from the city, is an important site for scholars investigating the "Eastern Domain" of the Indus Valley or Harappan Civilization. 'Naurangabad mound' is situated 10 km away from Bhiwani city and is known for the excavation site for antique coins, tools, toys, sieves, pots, and statues that are 2500 years old and belong to the era of Youdheya, Kushan and Gupta dynasties. Technological Institute of Textile, commonly known as TIT mills was established way back in 1911, also known as Grasim Bhiwani Textile Ltd. Chinar fabric is also one of the important textile mills of the city. In addition, Hindustan Gum & Chemical Ltd established in 1956, is a leading manufacturer and importer of Guar Gum in India and produces Guar Seeds, Guar Splits, and Guar Gum Powder.

Bhiwani has been traditionally a hub of higher education. It can boast of many degree colleges including Vaish College, Adarsh College for Women, MNS Government PG College, Government College for Women, besides many colleges of education. Bhiwani has emerged as a major Centre of Indian Boxing as all the four boxers representing India at Beijing Olympics 2008 are products of Sports Authority of India (SAI) boxing hostel at Bhiwani. Bhiwani is a hub of wrestling also. Furthermore, Bhiwani has been a rich centre of Sanskrit learning. To add another feather to the glorious cap, the Government of Haryana has established a state University in the name of Chaudhary Bansi Lal and has thus given an impetus to the learning environment in the region.

As a state University recognized by the University Grants Commission (UGC), under 2(f), CBLU envisages establishing and perpetuating the tradition of excellence in innovative teaching, research and community outreach with the objective of fulfilling the societal responsibilities—local as well as global. Located in Bhiwani, the University has 60 affiliated colleges spread over two districts— Bhiwani and Charkhi Dadri with the enrolment of more than 40,000 students.

It offers various career-oriented undergraduate, postgraduate and doctoral programmes under ten faculties, namely, Humanities; Social Sciences; Life Sciences; Physical Sciences; Commerce and Management; Pharmaceutical Sciences; Behavioral & Cognitive Sciences; Information and Technology; Earth, Environment & Space Sciences; and Sports Sciences.

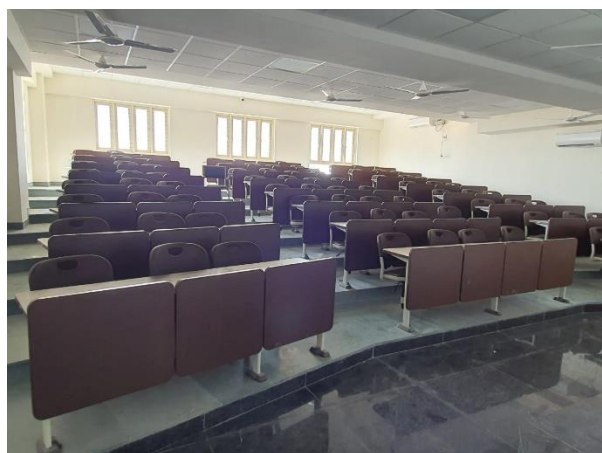
The University has well qualified and experienced faculty, state-of-the-art laboratories and research facilities, a conducive environment for extra and co-curricular activities.



विश्वविद्यालय एक परिचय

चौधरी बंसी लाल विश्वविद्यालय भिवानी
की स्थापना सन् 2014 में हरियाणा सरकार के
अधिनियम क्रमांक 25 के अंतर्गत
राज्य विश्वविद्यालय के रूप में की गई।

इस विश्वविद्यालय को विश्वविद्यालय अनुदान आयोग के सेक्शन-2 एफ के अंतर्गत मान्यता प्राप्त है। विश्वविद्यालय की स्थापना का उद्देश्य भिवानी तथा आसपास के ग्रामीण क्षेत्रों में विद्यार्थियों को उच्च शिक्षा प्राप्ति का अवसर उपलब्ध कराना है तथा समाज के साथ जुड़कर लोक कल्याण करना है। विज्ञान, स्वास्थ्य तथा खेलों पर विशेष ध्यान देते हुए इस विश्वविद्यालय के अंतर्गत बहु-अनुशासनिक विषयों में स्नातक, स्नातकोत्तर तथा तुलनात्मक एवं अंतर्विद्यावर्ती शोध कार्यक्रम उपलब्ध हैं। वर्तमान में भौतिक विज्ञान संकाय, जैव विज्ञान संकाय, मानविकी संकाय, सामाजिक विज्ञान संकाय, वाणिज्य संकाय तथा प्रबन्धन संकाय, खेल संकाय के अंतर्गत कुल 21 विभाग कार्यरत हैं, जिनमें अध्यापन-अध्यापन तथा शोध कार्य सुचारू रूप से चल रहा है। इसके अतिरिक्त इस विश्वविद्यालय से वर्तमान में 60 महाविद्यालय सम्बद्ध हैं। यह एक विकसनशील विश्वविद्यालय है, जो निकट भविष्य में शैक्षिक, क्रीड़ा तथा शोध गतिविधियों की दृष्टि से भारत के प्रसिद्ध विश्वविद्यालयों में गिना जाएगा। विद्यार्थियों के सर्वांगीण विकास को ध्यान में रखते हुए विश्वविद्यालय अनुदान आयोग के निर्देशानुसार (CBCS) चयन आधारित क्रेडिट पद्धति पर आधारित पाठ्यक्रम का निर्माण किया गया है। विश्वविद्यालय में मुक्त ऐच्छिक विषय, कौशल संवर्द्धन कार्यक्रमों तथा हॉबी कक्षाओं का प्रावधान सह-शैक्षिक गतिविधियों का प्रमुख अंग हैं, जिससे विद्यार्थियों को बिना तनाव के अपने विषय के अतिरिक्त ज्ञान प्राप्ति का अवसर मिलता है। स्नातकोत्तर स्तर पर 'चरित्र निर्माण एवं व्यक्तित्व का समग्र विकास' विषय को लागू करने वाला यह देश का पहला विश्वविद्यालय है। विश्वविद्यालय में राष्ट्रीय तथा अंतर्राष्ट्रीय संगोष्ठियों, उद्बोधन गतिविधियों तथा कार्यशालाओं में देश-विदेश के विद्वानों को समय-समय पर विद्यार्थियों के मार्गदर्शन के लिए आमंत्रित किया जाता है। विद्यार्थियों का सर्वांगीण विकास करना विश्वविद्यालय का प्रमुख उद्देश्य है। विश्वविद्यालय में विभिन्न आश्वासन प्रकोष्ठ जैसे आंतरिक गुणवत्ता प्रकाशन प्रकोष्ठ (IQAC) तथा नियोजन प्रकोष्ठ (Placement Cell) भी शिक्षा की गुणवत्ता तथा महत्ता को स्थापित करने में अपना योगदान कर रहे हैं। भिवानी को सांस्कृतिक तथा क्रीड़ा गतिविधियों के हब के रूप में स्थापित करने में विश्वविद्यालय की महत्त्वपूर्ण भूमिका है। 131 एकड़ में स्थाई कैम्पस, जिसमें सुसज्जित स्मार्ट क्लास रूम, नवीनतम तकनीक की प्रयोगशालाएं, खेल स्टेडियम एवं पुस्तकालय निर्माणाधीन हैं। भिवानी केवल हरियाणा प्रदेश का ही नहीं अपितु भारत का एक सुप्रसिद्ध नगर माना जाता है। यह नगर दीर्घकाल से शिक्षा विशेषकर संस्कृत का केन्द्र रहा है। इसलिए यह नगर छोटी काशी के नाम से विख्यात है। इस नगर का सांस्कृतिक, ऐतिहासिक, पुरातात्विक, औद्योगिक और व्यापारिक दृष्टि से महत्त्व भारत के मानचित्र पर अंकित है। भारतीय स्वतन्त्रता संग्राम में भी भिवानी का महत्त्वपूर्ण योगदान रहा है। यहाँ के स्वतन्त्रता सेनानियों और सेना के वीर सैनिकों ने देश रक्षा में महत्त्वपूर्ण भूमिका का निर्वाह कर मातृभूमि के मस्तक को ऊँचा किया है। इस प्रकार विश्वविद्यालय अपने विद्यार्थियों के शारीरिक, मानसिक, बौद्धिक, भावात्मक तथा आध्यात्मिक विकास के लक्ष्य की प्राप्ति हेतु निरंतर अग्रसर है।

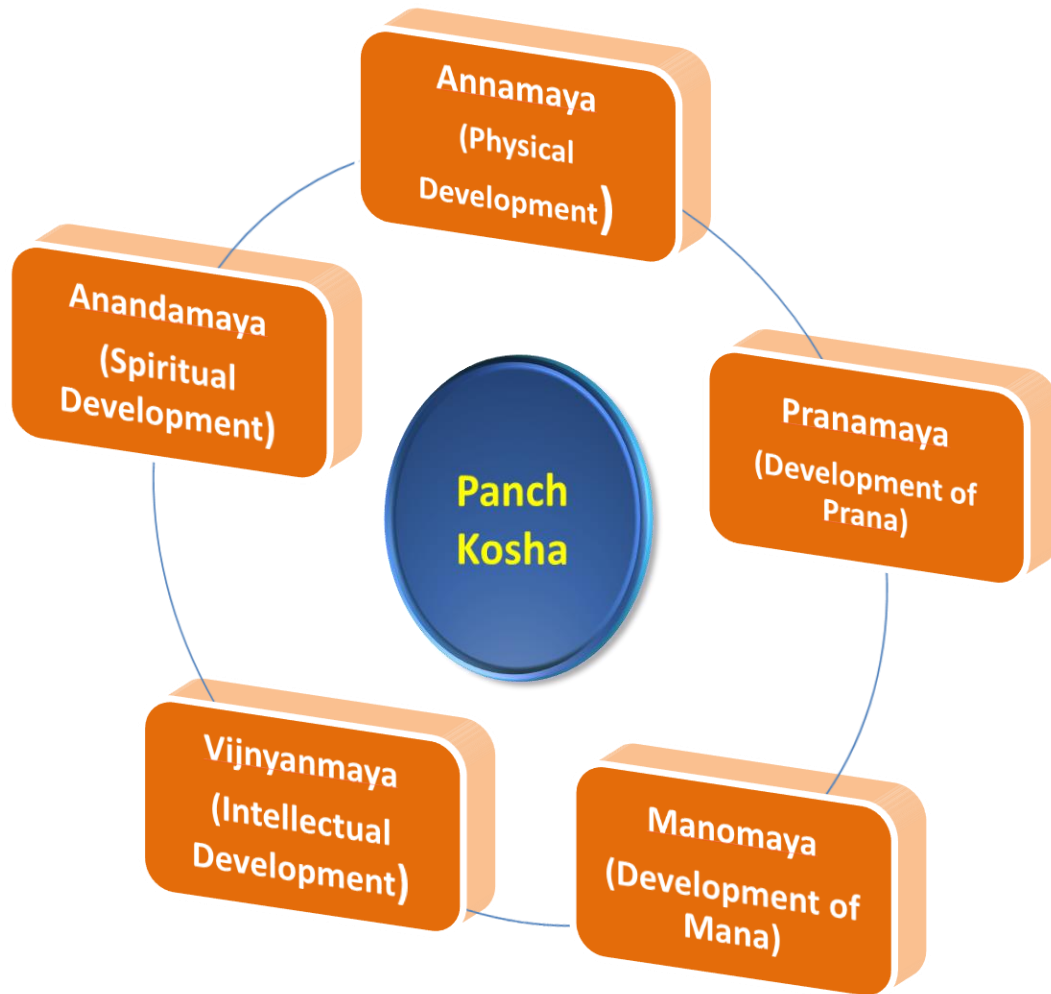
MISSION

LIBRARY

The University maintains a well-stocked library having rich collection of more than 22612 books covering a wide range of disciplines, 42 Print journals and 07 are in process for purchase, 7129 E-journals, 10 magazines and 16 newspapers to support quality teaching and research. The library is fully automated using KOHA – Open Source Integrated Library System. The library has access to E-resources through NDL, ProQuest database and the resources available in Public Domain. Plagiarism Check service is offered through Urkund and Turnitin Softwares, free of cost to the researchers, students and faculty members of the University.



SPORTS AND PHYSICAL EDUCATION

Bhiwani is a well-known city of Haryana most often termed as mini Cuba in the field of Sports. Bhiwani is a power hub of sports of Haryana as well as India. More than 100 centres for nurturing the youth are being run around the city. The students of University teaching departments and affiliated colleges also participate in different All India Inter-university (AIU) Championships as well as National and International competitions. During the session 2019-20 the University organized an AIU Women Wrestling Championship in a successful way. Chaudhary Bansi Lal University is achieving heights of glory in the field of sports. Four students were selected in World University Games to be held in China in 2021. Twenty-Three sportspersons representing CBLU Bhiwani took part in the first Khelo India national games held at Ranchi, Bhubaneshwar and obtained 18th position out of 159 Universities winning 4 gold and 2 bronze medals. The University has adequate sports facilities.

YOUTH WELFARE DEPARTMENT

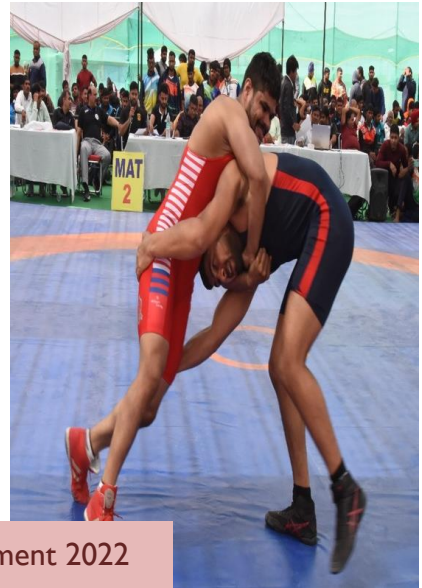

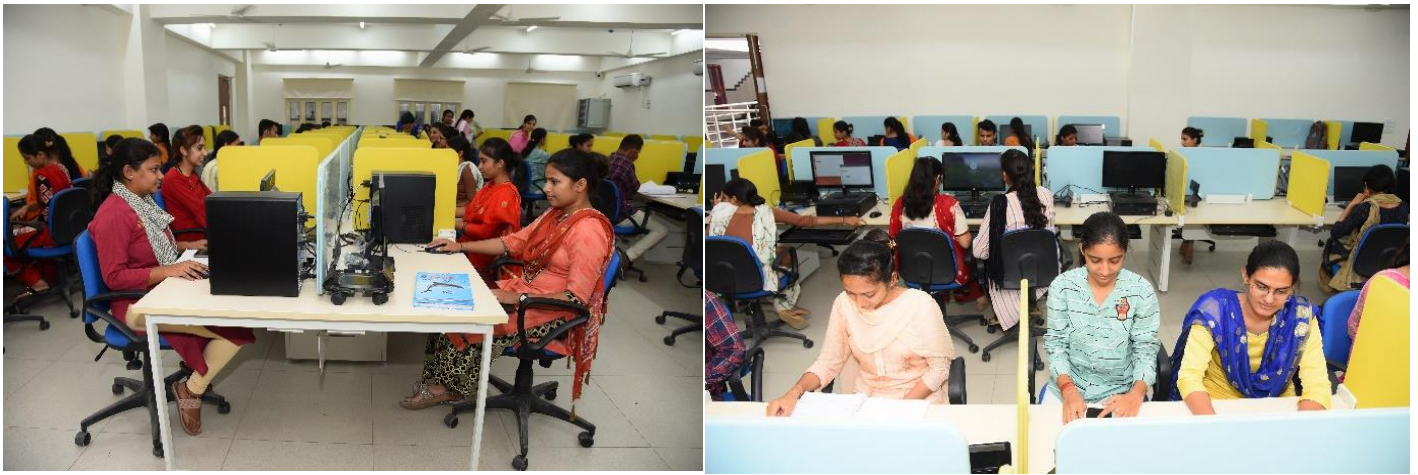


COMPUTER CENTRE

RESEARCH

The University, realizing the importance of research, has taken several steps to promote the culture of innovation, creativity and research on the campus. These include the development of research labs, computer and other facilities, internet connectivity, financial assistance to faculty to attend the National and International conferences. National funding agencies such as DBT, ICMR and ICSSR have sanctioned research projects to the faculties of the University. The University is running Doctoral Programmes (Ph.D.) in ten different disciplines such as Zoology, Biotechnology, Chemistry, Mathematics, English, Political Science, Commerce, Management, Physics and Geography. University has also framed its research promotion policy and consultancy rules. Moreover, to support the research scholars who are not receiving any scholarship from other funding agencies, the University has planned to start a University Research Scholarship.

SARDAR PATEL CENTER FOR COMPETITIVE EXAMS

SARDAR PATEL CENTER FOR COMPETITIVE EXAMS was established on 19 November 2020, for preparing students of South Haryana for UPSC, HPSC, SSC, Banking, Railways and other competitive exams.

Since its inception, the center has completed an Online Crash Course for HPSC/UPSC Preliminary exams for General Studies, Civil Service Aptitude Tests from 19 April to 26 May 2021 and an Online Crash Course for UPSC/HPSC Mains Exams (for General Hindi and General English) from 18th October 2021 to 15 November 2021.

Master of Science (Chemistry)

The Department of Chemistry was established in the year 2014. At present, the department offers four-semester M.Sc. programme (organic, inorganic & physical specialization), Dual degree B.Sc. (honors) and M.Sc. programme and Ph.D. programme. The courses have been designed with the aim of fulfilling the demands of trained human resource to give thrust to ever increasing chemical industry and related fields. The department has adopted the UGC Model Curriculum for this programme, to enable its students to be absorbed in various institutions and industries in India and abroad. Group discussion, seminar, self-study etc. are essential components of this programme to enhance the in-depth understanding of the subject to be able to tackle problems independently and to enable the students to accept the new challenges in the thrust area of chemical science in the present



scenario. The department of Chemistry has highly competent and efficient faculty with a strong commitment to teaching as well as research work. The department has well-equipped laboratories with facilities such as NMR, UV-Visible spectrophotometer, ball mill etc. Research is carried out in all major areas of chemical and allied sciences. Major thrust research areas of the department are material chemistry, heterocyclic chemistry, medicinal chemistry, hypervalent iodine chemistry, applications of reagents in chemistry, green chemistry, synthetic organic chemistry, theoretical chemistry, computational chemistry, physical chemistry, inorganic chemistry, pharmaceutical chemistry, nanochemistry, natural products chemistry, radiation chemistry, nuclear medicine, supramolecular chemistry, energy storage devices etc. The department is committed to extend

collaborations with various renowned institutions to further accelerate the research. For the holistic intellectual development of the students, department frequently organizes various activities like extension lectures, workshops, conferences, seminars, quizzes and several other competitions. Besides this, Hobby Club, Open Elective Course etc. are some of the newer inclusions in

the syllabi, which provide a more liberal and permissive atmosphere to the learners. The faculty members have published their research findings in the journals of national and international repute. The faculty members attract substantial financial support for their research activities. The faculty actively organizes scientific meetings from time to time and they are invited to deliver lectures in various national and international conferences and symposia. The Department offers a vibrant atmosphere to students and faculty to nurture the spirit of scientific inquiry and to pursue cutting-edge research in a highly encouraging environment. Our alumni have been placed at various reputed organizations and they are serving the society while some have cleared NET/JRF examination.



Master of Science (Mathematics)

This programme consisting of four semesters was started in 2014. The student intake for the session 2022-23 is 50. The department has Computer laboratories equipped with modern software such as LATEX, MATLAB, SPSS, MINITAB, C++. The department has experienced and well-qualified faculty members. The Department of Mathematics is pioneering in the modern subjects like mathematics with computers and Industrial mathematics. Apart from the regular classes and practicals, the organization of workshops, seminars, conferences and guest lectures is also the distinctive feature that ensures the proper grooming of the students. The department successfully keeps up with the high-end requirements of the industry and focuses on the professional development of the students. Our passed-out students are providing public and professional services in different areas. The department has offered Ph.D. programme in Applied Mathematics, especially in Theoretical Seismology from the session 2019-2020,. The Department is also running the departmental library with books sponsored by National Board of Higher Mathematics(NBHM), India. The department offers an open elective course in Vedic Mathematics for the students of other departments.



Certificate course in Vedic Mathematics

This programme aims to make Mathematics easy and interesting. It is offered by the University in collaboration with the Shiksha Sanskriti Utthan Nyas (SSUN), New Delhi. Vedic Mathematics helps an individual to solve mathematical problems 10-15 times faster and reduces scratch work and finger counting. It also improves mental calculation, increases concentration, enhances logical thinking process, develops confidence and can be used in competitive exams like CAT, CET, SAT, Banking exams, etc.

Master of Science (Physics)

Master of Science (Zoology)

Master of Science (Botany)

PG Diploma in Public Health

The goal of public health is to improve health outcomes for population through the achievement of the objectives of preventing diseases and health consequences of environmental hazards either natural or manmade disasters promoting behaviors that reduce the risk of communicable diseases and non-communicable diseases.

The new diploma course will be encompassing all modern tools of molecular biology, genetics, microbiology, nanotechnology and artificial intelligence for detection and drug delivery. The students from bio-sciences, life-sciences, medical sciences with bachelor degree, are entitled to apply for this course which offers 20 seats that will be filled on the basis of university policy of admission.

B . Pharmacy

It is a four-year undergraduate programme in the field of Pharmacy education for anyone who wants to practice as a pharmacist in hospitals, as Drug Inspector, and as a manufacturing chemist in the Pharmaceutical industry. B. Pharmacy is the study of preparing and conferring drugs and medicines for several illnesses and deficiencies. This programme provides a large number of job opportunities in both the public and private sectors. Pharmacists can work especially in a range of industries related to the prescription, manufacture and provision of medicines. Total intake in B. Pharmacy programme is 60 and the admission will be through an entrance examination conducted by the Haryana State Technical Education Society (HSTES).



M. Pharmacy

It is a Postgraduate programme in Pharmaceutical Sciences offered with three specializations: Industrial Pharmacy, Pharmacology and Drug Regulatory Affairs.

- **Industrial Pharmacy (IP)** includes manufacturing, development and quality assurance of drugs.
- **Pharmacology (Pharmacology)** deals with the effects of chemical agents of therapeutic value or with the potential toxicity on biological systems for the development of drugs.
- **Drug Regulatory Affairs (DRA)** is a course in which the candidates learn about resolutions that regulate healthcare industries (Pharmaceuticals, Medical Devices, Biologics and Functional Foods).

The Department of Pharmaceutical Sciences was started in 2015, Pharmacy courses are approved by Pharmacy Council of India (PCI). the Department is equipped with high-tech instruments and well-maintained laboratories in the subjects of Pharmaceutics, Pharmacology and Drug Regulatory Affairs for conducting first-grade research in the area of drug discovery, development and evaluation. Master of Science (M.Sc.) in Computer Science

The Department of Information and Communication Technology was established in 2019 to prepare next-gen IT professionals who are competent enough to take up industry challenges effectively. The department intends to provide cutting-edge education ranging from expertise in traditional software development to modern computing technologies. The department is equipped with state-of-the-art laboratories, industry-aligned curriculum and



association with top IT companies to provide students education which meets the need of the industry.

From the academic session 2019-20, M.Sc. (Computer Science) programme has been launched with an intake of 30 students. The programme was started with three specializations of Data Analytics, Cyber Security and Networking keeping in mind the current requirements and scope of the Information Technology and to acquaint students with the latest concept of Artificial Intelligence and Internet of Things.

An exit scheme for students of M.Sc. Computer Science has been implemented w.e.f. 2020-2021 in which a student of

M.Sc. Computer Science (2-Year) of the University Teaching Department and Affiliated Colleges of the University may exit the programme after completion of the first year in all respect and after that, he/she may be granted a One-year diploma certificate i.e. Post Graduate Diploma in Computer Applications (PGDCA). The programme of such candidate may be considered as Post Graduate Diploma in Computer Applications (PGDCA).

Post Graduate Diploma in Computer Applications (PGDCA)

PG Diploma in Computer Applications (PGDCA) is a PG level one-year diploma programme started from session 2020-21. Candidates who have completed a relevant Bachelor's Degree programme can take admission in PGDCA admission. On course completion, successful candidates will obtain a PG Diploma certificate. This programme covers an in-depth approach towards computer applications and allied areas such as – computer programming, internet technology, programming languages, networking, database management, software development, information technology etc.

A promotion scheme of students of PGDCA has been implemented w.e.f. 2020-2021, in which a student of Post Graduate Diploma in Computer Applications (PGDCA) of University Teaching Department and Affiliated colleges of the University can pursue 2-Year M.Sc. Computer Science programme after completing the first year of PGDCA if he/she desires and after that he/she may be promoted to 2nd Year of M.Sc. Computer Science provided that the student must have passed 1st semester examination. After completion of the programme, M.Sc. Computer Science (2-Year) degree may be granted to the student.

PG Diploma in Cyber Security and Law (PGDCSL)

The objective of the programme is to provide an overview of Cyber Security issues, tools and techniques that is critical in solving problems in cyber security domains; to learn the concepts of computer security, cryptography, digital money, secure protocols, detection and other security techniques including protecting Information, Systems, IT infrastructure, analysing and monitoring potential threats and attacks, devising security architecture and implementing security solutions. After completion of this course, the students will be able to understand, design and implement appropriate security technologies and policies to protect computers and digital information.

3. To promote pattern of values, belief systems and behaviour enshrined in our culture.
4. To strengthen the bond between the teacher and the taught. To evolve a coherent system of instruction based on the interests, aptitude and abilities of the students.
5. To make the teaching -learning process more student-centric & friendly and make students independent learner.
6. To provide opportunity to the students to add creative contents while building up their career.
7. To enrich the environment of educational institutions with opportunities for divergent thinking and learning opportunities.

CENTRE FOR MONITORING HOBBY CLASSES

The Centre for Monitoring Hobby Classes (CMHC) has specifically been established to promote activities of interests to students and enhance their outward orientation. An activity of specific nature shall be encouraged through a particular club. CMHC shall monitor the functioning of clubs created in the University and in the affiliated colleges and shall present a report on the same along with suggestions to further strengthen them. The activities of CMHC shall include developing syllabi for each hobby club, preparing the list of experts who could be involved in these clubs, suggesting measures for integration of hobby classes in the general teaching-learning process and developing study material.

FUNCTIONING OF THE HOBBY CLUBS

List of clubs and their teacher-Incharges will be floated at the beginning of each session and every student will mandatorily choose one club as per his / her choice. HODs, within a period of one week after start of regular classes for the new session, will collect the information from each student regarding his/her hobby/area of interest. A special Proforma for collecting the data regarding hobby of individual student shall be designed and circulated to students preferably online. All the students who have expressed their intention to pursue a particular hobby will become members of that hobby club. Workshops, exhibitions, camps etc. will be integrated in to the course work and will be frequently organized in each of the semesters. Convener and Co-coordinator of the Centre for Hobby Clubs shall see the supervision, coordination and review of the Working of these clubs.

CRITERIA FOR EVALUATION (BOTH FOR UG AND PG PROGRAMMES)

The total weightage of Hobby Club courses will be 4 credits, however, these credits will not be added to the SGPA / CGPA of the student. The hobby courses will be evaluated for one credit in each semester (Semester 1 - 4), however they will be counted together for the purpose of grading. The final letter grade will be reflected in the final award sheet of the students with the name as Hobby Club.

The following evaluation policy will be followed for both UG as well as in PG programmes:

- (a) Attendance of the student (50%)
- (b) Participation in the events organised by the club (15%)
- (c) Organising the in-house club events (15%)
- (d) Participation or organising a national or state level event related to the hobby club (10%)
- (e) Position (First, Second or Third) in the national or state level event related to the hobby club (10%).

The marks of the attendance will be counted in the following manner:

- Less than 60%: No Marks
- 60%-75%: 30 Marks
- 76%-90%: 40 Marks
- 91%-100%: 50 Marks

5. The Venue for entrance test shall be New Campus, Prem Nagar, Bhiwani.

1.5. Admission

- A. The applicants are advised to keep checking the Admission Portal for updates related to Admissions.
- B. The applicants shall be considered in the Admission List only if their Qualifying Examination results are updated on the Admission Portal.
- C. The formula for conversion of CGPA into percentage for the undergraduate courses will be as per UGC guidelines
- D. In case of CGPA, the final calculated percentage will not be rounded off and will be considered only up to 2 decimal places.
- E. Admission Lists (category wise) of the selected candidates will be uploaded on the University website, as per the given schedule.

GENERAL GUIDELINES FOR ADMISSION PROCEDURE

The following procedure shall be followed for **selection of the candidates for admission** to various programmes:

1. Before filling the Admission Application Form, the candidates are required to read the Prospectus/guidelines/ instructions available on the University website carefully. Candidates will submit their Application Forms online on the University website: www.cblu.ac.in for admission to various Programmes/Courses.
2. The minimum eligibility and number of seats for admission to various courses will remain same as per information Brochure 2022-23. Kindly visit University Website for more details and changes, if any.
3. In case, at the time of third counselling, the seat(s) of various reserved categories remain vacant and no eligible candidate of the reserved categories is available then the vacant seats may be thrown open to Haryana General Category/AIO category on that date itself as per rules of the University with the permission of Vice Chancellor.
4. Mere possession of the prescribed academic qualifications does not entitle a candidate for admission to the programme. Candidates would be required to fulfil all the conditions as spelt out in the Prospectus.
5. The eligibility of the candidates shall be ascertained at the time of preparing merit list however the admission seekers are required to ensure that they possess the prescribed qualification for the programme, they are seeking admission.
6. Merit list of all the eligible candidates shall be prepared as per criteria given in the Prospectus and shall be available on the website of the University and notice board of Department.
7. If two or more candidates secure identical merit, then the candidate senior in age will be given preference. In case if date of birth is same then the marks of qualifying exam will be taken into account. If result of qualifying exam is also identical then the marks obtained in next lower class will be considered.
8. The merit list for admission to the programmes will be prepared by the Departments/Institutes of the Universities as per "Schedule" given in the Prospectus and will be uploaded on the website. No separate communication shall be sent in this regard.
9. The candidate whose name appears in the admitted candidates (in Merit list) shall have to deposit the fee with in stipulated time or else his/her seat will be considered vacant.
10. Seats remaining vacant in one round of counselling, will be filled up in the subsequent round of counselling.
11. Counselling will be closed as soon as all the seats in each category are filled.
12. Candidate must be physically present for the counselling. In case of Medical Emergency, a medical certificate to that effect be submitted from the registered medical practitioner.
13. If the concerned authorities are not satisfied with the character / past behaviour / antecedents of a candidate, they may refuse to admit him/her to any course of study in the University / College in order to ensure academic standards, discipline and peaceful atmosphere in the University. The Vice-Chancellor may cancel the admission of any student for a specified period.
14. A student having done the Post-Graduation in one subject can't seek admission to another regular Post-Graduation course. Further, a candidate who has completed a professional course like (M.Ed., M.B.A.) without having any regular PG Degree may also apply for regular PG course. (To be decided and confirmed by authorities)
15. In case any candidate is found to have supplied false information, certificates, documents etc. or is found to have withheld or concealed some information in his/her Application Form, he/she shall be liable to be debarred from admission to the course and legal action may be taken against the candidate.
 - a. If a candidate is admitted on the basis of the information submitted by him/her, which is found to be incorrect or false at a later stage, his/her admission will be cancelled and all fees and other dues paid by him/her shall be forfeited. The University/Institute may also take further action, as deemed fit, against the candidate and his/her guardian.
 - b. Details of participation in the counselling and procedure of seat allotment will be made available soon on the website of CBLU, Bhiwani (www.cblu.ac.in)
 - c. For other details such as regarding enrolment of students, submission of registration/continuation Return, student's conduct and disciplinary rules, prohibition of ragging, etc, the website of the University may be visited.
16. For any kind of dispute due to non-availability of rules/regulations of interpretation of rules/ regulations adopted during physical counselling the decision of Vice Chancellor will be final.

Additional/Supernumerary Seats (To be filled up by Physical Counselling only) UGC approved courses in UTDs

In addition to the sanctioned seats, there will be additional seats for the following categories. The candidates seeking admission against these categories will have to apply online and after that their admission will be made by Physical Counselling only as per the rules of the University.

1. One additional seat for Outstanding Sports Persons.
2. One additional seat for Single Girl Child.
3. One supernumerary seat for participating in Cultural Activities.
4. Two additional seats for Kashmiri Migrants.
5. 10% seats for NRI Candidates.
6. 15% seats for Foreign Candidates.
7. Two additional seat for Residents of Prem Nagar village

Since these seats are additional/supernumerary, they will not be converted at all in any other category in case they remain unfilled.

Note: -

- 1. The reservation of seats is as per Reservation Policy of State Government of Haryana and is subject to change/amendment made by the State Government of Haryana from time to time and the same is applicable on the University also.**
- 2. The HODs of the concerned departments are requested to ensure that the admissions are made according to reservation policy.**

ADMISSION AGAINST ADDITIONAL/ SUPERNUMERARY SEATS

Additional/Supernumerary seats will be filled up as per norms, guidelines and eligibility prescribed by CBLU, Bhiwani.

1. FOR SPORTS PERSONS

There will be one additional seat for Outstanding Sports Person in all courses over and above the sanctioned seats. Such candidates will have to submit a Grading Certificate issued by the Director, Directorate of Sports and Youth Welfare, Government of Haryana, Chandigarh.

The following will be the Criteria for admission to these seats, provided the candidate is otherwise eligible:

- I. 1st preference will be given to Sports Persons who have got positions (I /II /III) in an International Championship/ World cup/Olympics/Common Wealth Games/Asian Games.
- II. Candidate who represented India in the Tournaments mentioned in clause -I.
- III. Candidate who have won any positions (I/II/III) in All Indian Inter-University/Senior National Championship during Graduation.

Events organized by Private Organizations/Associations will not be recognized for the purpose of admission.

2. FOR SINGLE GIRL CHILD

One seat in each course will be reserved for single girl child. The admission against this seat will be made on the basis of Merit. The students seeking admission under this category will be required to submit the following documents:

- I. An affidavit for only (single) girl child on non-judicial stamp paper of Rs. 50/- duly attested by first class magistrate.
- II. Copy of Ration Card along with the page where student's name is mentioned (self- attested) Hindi or English version of the same, if the ration card is in any regional language. (In case of non-availability of Ration Card enclose a certificate from a local reputed person who knows your family very well).

3. FOR STUDENTS EXCELLING IN CULTURAL ACTIVITIES

One supernumerary seat in each course in the University Teaching Departments is earmarked to promote cultural activities subject to the fulfilment of the following conditions:

- I. Any position in the National Youth Festival organized by the Association of Indian Universities, New Delhi or the first position holder in the North Zone Inter University Youth Festival organized by the Association of Indian Universities.
- II. Events organized by Private Organizations/Associations will not be recognized for the purpose of admission.

4. FOR KASHMIRI MIGRANTS

Two additional seats in each course offered in the University is earmarked for Kashmiri Migrants. For the wards of Kashmiri migrants there will be: -

- I. Relaxation in cut off percentage up to 10%, subject to minimum eligibility conditions.
- II. 5% increase in the intake capacity in each course offered.
- III. No domicile certificate is required.

The University earmarked the seats reserved for the Jammu & Kashmir Migrants in a specific programme of study at the time of counseling as per current practice. If any guideline is received from the Government before the commencement of counseling for the academic session 2022-23, the same shall be applied.

5. FOR NRI CANDIDATES

10% seats over and above the existing sanctioned intake are meant for actual NRI candidates and their children or wards in all programmes.

6. FOR FOREIGN CANDIDATES

15% additional supernumerary seats for foreign candidates out of which 5% seats have been earmarked for the children of Indian workers in the Gulf Countries and South Asia. These seats will not be filled, if such foreign candidates are not available.

7. For Residents of Prem Nagar Village

As per the 26th Meeting of EC held on 04-11-2020, Res. No. 20 and 5th Meeting of AC held on 22-04-2021, Agenda no. 03, the provision for one seat has been made in some programmes but later on provision for one extra seat i.e. in total 2 seats has been made in all the University Teaching Departments which are not governed by any regulatory bodies like AICTE, NCTE, PCI etc. This provision has been made over and above the existing intake as a supernumerary seat. Such students need to be eligible as per the eligibility requirement of concerned programme and the admission be made on the basis of merit from amongst

those who applied against these seats. The seat is offered in the all the University Teaching Departments.

NOTE: A student having completed the Post-Graduation in one subject is not eligible to seek admission in another regular Post Graduate course except in case of professional course like MBA etc.

REPORTING OF THE SELECTED CANDIDATE IN THE DEPARTMENT

The candidates who are admitted shall have to remain in contact with their respective department for information related to submission of all original documents (i.e. in support of Academic Qualifications, Character Certificate, category certificate, income certificate etc.) as per his/her claim for admission, time-table, classes and for any other information.

The candidates are advised to submit two sets of photocopies of all relevant documents as mentioned above with two passport size photographs to the concerned department as per the date and time suggested by the HOD/Incharge.

CURBING THE MENACE OF RAGGING

1. Ragging in educational institutions is banned and anyone found guilty of ragging and /or abetting ragging. Whether actively or passively, or being a part of conspiracy to promote ragging, is liable to be punished in accordance with the UGC Regulations on Curbing the Menace of Ragging in Higher Educational Institutions, 2009 as well as under the panel law for the time being in force.
2. The following will be termed as the act of ragging: any disorderly conduct whether by words spoken or written or by any act, which has the effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness any other student(s), indulging in rowdy or in-disciplined activities which causes or is likely to cause annoyance, hardship or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in fresher or junior student(s) or asking the student(s) to do any act or perform something, which such student(s) will not do in the ordinary course and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the physique or psyche of a fresher or a junior student.
3. Junior students may contact their Chairpersons or other university functionaries like proctor, Dean Students Welfare or Security Officer for help and guidance.
4. Each University will upload the instructions against ragging on its website along with Anti Ragging Helping Toll Free Number and will also make an Anti-Ragging Committee as per UGC Regulations.
5. Candidate is required to submit the undertakings to ensure that they shall not be indulge in ragging (above type of activities)- (Annexure XIX, XX).

RESERVATION OF SEATS IN VARIOUS PROGRAMMES

The seat matrix has been prepared on the basis of the reservation policy notified by the Govt. of Haryana vide Notification No. 22/10/2013 - IGSIII dated 28/2/2013, and instructions received from the State Govt. from time to time on the following basis:

a) All India Open Category Seats (Including Haryana State) (AIO)	15% of the sanctioned intake
b) State Quota	85% of the sanctioned intake
(b-1) Haryana Open General Category (HOGC)	50% of the State Quota i.e. 42.5% of total intake
(b-2) Reserved Categories of Haryana	50% of the State Quota i.e. 42.5% of total intake
Scheduled Caste (SC)*	20% of State Quota (17% of total intake)
Backward Classes of Haryana (A)(BCA)	16% of State Quota (13.6% of total intake)
Backward Classes of Haryana (B)(BCB)	11% of State Quota (9.35% of total intake)
Person with Disability (PwD)	3% of State quota (2.55% of total intake)
Economically Weaker Section (EWS)**	10% reservation for Economically Weaker Section (EWS) will be 50% of the State Quota and will be 42.5% of the total intake (i.e. 50% of General Category out of 85% of Haryana domicile). Calculation for EWS will be done on existing number of Seats. (10% reservation is to be given in both State Quota seats under State Policy and all India Quota seats under Central Government Policy separately)

In the event of quota reserved for Physically Handicapped remain unutilized due to non-availability for suitable category of Handicapped Candidates, it may be offered to the Ex-Servicemen and their wards (1%) and the dependents of Freedom Fighters (1%).

Further, 3% reservation is also provided to Ex-serviceman/ Freedom Fighter and their dependents by providing reservation within reservation of 1% of General Category, 1% out of Scheduled Caste and 1% from Backward Classes category for admission to the various educational institutions of the Govt. and Govt. aided / Institutes located in Haryana. As far as Block allocation in Block-A and Block-B of Backward Classes category is concerned, year wise rotational system will be adopted. For example, if Block-A of Backward Classes are given seats in academic year 2018, the next Block i.e. (B) Block of Category of Backward Classes will be given seats in the next academic year 2019 and so on. Further, a roster register for reservation of seats for Ex-Servicemen/Freedom Fighter shall be maintained and carried forward all fractions till one seat is accumulated through different fractions over the years. As and when the total comes to one, a seat will be provided.

*** Fifty percent of the twenty percent seats reserved for Scheduled castes for admission in any Govt. Educational Institution shall be set aside for candidates belonging to deprived scheduled castes as enumerated in Annexure-X, for more detail please refer to Annexure X**

**** Annexure XIII & XIII-A**

GUIDELINES FOR RESERVATION

1. The reservation of seats is as per the Reservation Policy of Haryana Govt. and is subject to change/amendment made by the State Govt. from time to time.
2. Candidates belonging to SC/ST are required to submit a certificate from the competent authority as per Annexure-III. The list of Scheduled Castes notified by the Haryana Government is available at Annexure-VIII.
3. Candidates belonging to Backward Classes are required to submit a certificate from the competent authority as per Annexure-IV (1 &2). The list of Backward Classes in Haryana notified by the Haryana Government, is available at Annexure-IX. Circular no. 1170-SW (1)-95 dated 07.06.95 of the Haryana Govt. for excluding Socially Advanced Persons/Sections (Creamy Layer) from Backward Classes may be referred to at Annexure-XI.
4. The children or Grand Children (Maternal & Paternal) of Freedom Fighters are required to submit a certificate from the competent authority as per Annexure-V.
5. Only those candidates who have permanent disability of not less than 40% (being otherwise fit for admission to the programme) will be considered for admission as Physically Handicapped. They will submit a certificate from the competent authority as per Annexure-VI. Disability Certificate shall, however, be subject to verification by a Medical Board to be constituted by the University. The decision of Medical Board in this regard shall be final.
6. Children or Wards of Military Personnel (including personnel of Para-Military Forces killed in Action or Permanently Disabled in Action and Boarded Out from the Services or Ex-Servicemen and their wards) will be considered for reservation. They will submit a certificate as per Annexure-VI-A. The following categories of personnel of Territorial Army are included in the definition of Ex-Servicemen in terms of the State Govt. letter No. 12/18/2006-GS-II dated 08-01-2008:
 - i) Pension holders for continuous embodied service;
 - ii) Persons with disability attributable to military service;
 - iii) Gallantry Award Winners; and
 - iv) Such recruits boarded out/released on medical grounds and granted medical/disability pension.
7. A candidate who applies for a reserved category or for both reserved and general categories will be considered first in general category subject to the preference given for University/programme. In case, he is not selected in general category, he will be considered for reserved category. The Scheduled Castes/ Backward Classes candidates who get selected/admitted in Educational /Professional / Technical Institutions and Universities in open competition on the basis of their own merit, will not be counted against the quota reserved for scheduled caste/ backward classes, rather they will be treated as open competition candidates. However, such candidates shall fulfil condition of eligibility regarding age etc. as are meant for general category candidates (Memo No.13864-75 dated 24.08.2012 received from the Principal Secretary to Govt. of Haryana, Welfare of Scheduled Caste and Backward Classes, Department, Chandigarh).
8. If a candidate belongs to more than one reserved category, he/she shall be required to give his/her preference at the time of filling up the admission form. Preference once given shall not be changed.
9. If any seat remains vacant in sub-categories of BC (A) and BC (B), the same will be filled up through the candidates belonging to other category. For example, if any seat in BC (B) category remains vacant, the same will be filled up from BC (A) category and vice-versa.
10. As per the reservation policy of DGHE (Annexure XIII-A) 10% reservation is to be given in both State Quota seats under State Policy and all India Quota seats under Central Government Policy separately.
11. Benefit of reservation will be given to the reserved categories up to 3rd counselling. However, after third counselling rules of the concerned university will be followed regarding conversion of seats.

GUIDELINES RELATING TO FEE STRUCTURE

1. Programmes fee including examination fee is available in the Admission Brochure.
2. Selected candidates are required to deposit their dues online at University website.
3. Tuition fee and other dues will be payable for 12 months in the year i.e. from July to June. However, half tuition fee will be charged from girl students.
4. A student migrating from another University will be required to pay all the dues other than Tuition Fee and Amalgamated Fund, which will be charged with effect from the month following the one up to which these have been paid to the previous institution.
5. Dues must be paid on the dates notified; otherwise a late fee fine of Rs. 5/- (per day) up to 10 days from the dates notified and thereafter Rs. 10/- (per day) till the end of the month shall be charged. The name of the defaulter may be struck off the rolls, if the dues are not paid till the end of the month, unless permission is obtained from the Head of the Department concerned to make payment at later date within the next month. Students may be re- admitted with the permission of the Dean/Head of Department concerned on payment of Rs. 500/- along with the arrears of fee and/or fines provided that the Head of the Department is satisfied, that if re-admitted, the student will not fall short of the requisite percentage of attendance.
6. If the admission of a student is cancelled by the University for no fault of his/her, the fees and other dues paid by him/her will be refunded except the Admission Fee, provided the application to this effect duly recommended by the Dean/Head of the Department concerned is received in the University Office within one month of the date of the letter conveying the cancellation of admission. The application for the refund of dues submitted beyond the time limit prescribed above may be considered with permission of the Vice-Chancellor on merit.
7. The University employees/their wards/spouses including the wards of retired employees and wards of employees who die in harness shall be entitled to the following concessions:
 - Full Tuition fee concession.
 - Three fourth ($\frac{3}{4}$) of the Development Fee.

The University employees and their dependent wards will be given 50% concession on the total fee in the Self- Financing Courses. The employees or their wards shall, however, pay other normal dues.

8. If a student chooses to withdraw from the Programme of study in which he/she is enrolled, the institution concerned shall follow the following five-tier system for the refund of the fee* remitted by the student.

S.No.	Percentage of Refund of fees*	Point of time when notice of withdrawal of admission is received in the HEI
1	100%	15 days or more before the formally-notified last date of admission
2	90%	Less than 15 days before the formally-notified last date of admission
3	80%	15 days or less after the formally-notified last date of admission
4	50%	30 days or less, but more than 15 days, after formally-notified last date of admission
5	00%	More than 30 days after formally-notified last date of admission

9. In case of (1) in the table above, the HEI concerned shall deduct an amount not more than 5% of the fees paid by the student, subject to a maximum of Rs. 5,000/- as processing charges from the refundable amount.
10. Fees shall be refunded by all HEIs to an eligible student within fifteen days from the date of receiving a written application from him/her in this regard.

11. The payment will be made through RTGS/NEFT in the Bank account of the concern student. Full details of bank account along with self-attested photocopy of the same be obtained from the candidates
12. Late fee paid by a student shall not be refunded under any circumstances.
13. Fee concession to students who are Below Poverty Line and are Yellow Card holders will be governed by the following Guidelines:
 - Students including brothers and sisters belonging to this category will be allowed full tuition fee concession subject to the production of proof.
 - They will be allowed 50% concession in room rent, if they seek admission to the University hostels.
 - Only those students of this category will be allowed this concession in subsequent years who clear all the papers of the previous examination in the first attempt.
14. At the time of admission, fee may not be charged from the SC students whose parent's annual income is not more than 2.5 lacs. However, such candidates are required to apply online for Post-Matric Scholarship available on the website of Social Welfare Department, Govt. of Haryana. In case, anyone who fails to do so, he/she will have to pay full fee with the University Cashier. An undertaking to this effect must be submitted on the format available at Annexure XVIII. The claim on account of such fee may be submitted to the Higher Education Commissioner, Haryana, Panchkula after getting the same vetted from the Auditors of the Directorate for reimbursement.

Prescribed fees can be deposited through following modes only:

- Debit/ Credit Card (POS Machine)
- Net banking (link available on University website (www.cblu.ac.in))
- DD in favour of Finance Officer, Ch. Bansi Lal University, Bhiwani
- No cash/Cheque will be allowed

1. Post-Matric Scholarships for SC/ST students.
2. Post-Matric Scholarships/Maintenance allowance for BC/OBC students.
3. Stipends for dependent of freedom-fighters.
4. POSE scholarship scheme for students pursuing UG and PG courses in Science.
5. Scholarship for single girl child.

Migration:

The students taking admission in this University having their qualifying exam from any other University/ Board needs to submit the migration certificate up to the last date as decided by the concerned Branch/ Department, after that late fee will be charged as per University norms or any action can be taken by the authority.

Other Activities:

The **Bus Pass Facility** is available to all the regular students of this University as per details below:

1. For Boys: From University to Place of Residence (Upto 60 K.M.) as per the discounted rate by the Transport Department, Haryana for 6 months.
2. For Girls: From University to Place of Residence (Upto 150 K.M.) free by the Transport Department, Haryana for 6 months.

I am directed to invite your attention to Government instructions No. 62/17/95-6GS-I, dated 03.10.1996 and No. 62/03/2021-6GS-I, dated 14.01.2021 on the subject cited above and to say that Government has decided to further revise para 1(v) of the instructions as under :-

1(v) (A) For the purpose of Employment of Haryana Residents under the Haryana State Employment of Local Candidates, Act 2020 and for the purpose of Grant of Employment Generation Subsidy to industrial units under the Haryana Employment and Entrepreneurship Policy, 2020 or other sector specific industrial policies - Children/dependents/wards (if parents are not living) of persons who have permanent home in Haryana since a period not less than Five (5) years; or who have permanent home in Haryana since a period not less than Five (5) years but on account of their occupation they are living outside Haryana; or who do not have permanent residence in Haryana but have been residing in Haryana for a period not less than Five (5) years.

✓ (B) For the purpose of admissions, scholarships, unemployment allowance and weightage under Socio-economic Criteria - Children/dependents/wards (if parents are not living) of persons who have permanent home in Haryana since a period not less than Fifteen (15) years; or who have permanent home in Haryana since a period not less than Fifteen (15) years but on account of their occupation they are living outside Haryana; or who do not have permanent residence in Haryana but have been residing in Haryana for a period not less than Fifteen (15) years.

2. These instructions will be applicable with immediate effect and may please be brought to the notice of all concerned.

Instructions regarding Bonafide Residents of Haryana issued vide letter No.62/17/95-6 GSI dated 3rd October, 1996, No.62/32/2000-6GSI dated 23rd May, 2003, No.62/27/2003-6GSI dated 29th July, 2003 and No.62/62/2011- 6GSI dated 17th January, 2012 by the Chief Secretary to Government, Haryana.

Subject: Bonafide residents of Haryana - Guidelines regarding.

1. I am directed to invite your attention to Haryana Govt. letters noted in the margin on the subject noted above vide which the instructions were issued regarding simplification of procedure for obtaining the certificate of Domicile for the purpose of admission to educational institution (including technical/ medical institution). The matter has been reconsidered in the light of judgment delivered by the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India in the case of Dr Pradeep Jain vs. Union of India and others reported as AIR 1984-SC-1421, wherein it has been held that instead of the word 'Domicile' the word 'Resident' be used in the instructions issued by the State Government and it has been decided to revise the Government instructions. Henceforth, the following categories of persons would be eligible for the grant of Resident Certificate: -
 - (i) Candidates, who have passed the examination qualifying there for selection in an institution from a school/college in Haryana.
 - (ii) Children/Wards (if parents are not living)/Dependents: -
 - (a) of the regular employees of Haryana State posted in or outside Haryana State or working on deputation;
 - (b) of the regular employees of the statutory bodies/corporations established by or under an act of the State of Haryana who are posted in Chandigarh or in Haryana or outside Haryana.
 - (c) of the regular employees of the Government of India posted in Chandigarh or in Haryana in connection with the affairs of the Haryana Government;
 - (iii) Children/wards (if parents not living)/dependents of persons who after retirement have permanently settled in Haryana and draw their pensions from the treasuries situated in the State of Haryana.
 - (iv) Children/wards (if parents are not living)/dependents of pensioners of Haryana Government irrespective of the fact that the original home of the retiree is in a state other than Haryana or he has settled after retirement in or outside Haryana;
 - (v) Children/Wards (if parents are not living)/dependents of persons, who have permanent home in Haryana and include persons who have been residing in Haryana for a period of not less than 15 years or who have permanent home in Haryana but on account of their occupation they are living outside Haryana;
 - (vi) The wives of such persons who are bonafide residents of Haryana irrespective of the fact that they had belonged to any other State before marriage;
 - (vii) Persons who were born in Haryana and produce a certificate to that effect; provided that the parents/ guardians (if parents are not living) of persons belonging to any one of the above-mentioned categories are:
 - (a) Citizen of India;
 - (b) Produce an affidavit to the effect that they or their children/wards (if parents are not living)/dependents have not obtained the benefit of Resident in any other State.
 - (viii) Children & Wards of the accredited journalists residing at Chandigarh and recognized by Govt. of Haryana.
2. All candidates claiming to be bonafide residents of Haryana should produce a Haryana Resident Certificate signed by the District Magistrate/General Assistant to Deputy Commissioner or Sub-Divisional Officer (Civil) of the District/Sub-Divisions/Tehsildars of Revenue to which the candidates belong. Resident Certificates in respect of elsewhere or in respect of the Children/ Wards/Dependents of Haryana Govt. employees who are posted at Chandigarh, Delhi or elsewhere or in respect of Children/Wards/Dependents of pensioners of Haryana Govt. or in respect of the Children/Wards/Department of the employees of the Government of India posted at Chandigarh or in Haryana in connection with the affairs of Haryana Government, or in respect of Children/Wards/Dependents of the employees and retirees of the Statutory Bodies/Corporations of Haryana established by or under an Act of the State of Haryana or a Central Act and located at Chandigarh, Haryana or outside Haryana, should be by their respective Heads of Departments.
3. Candidates seeking admission in educational institutions (including medical and technical institutions) located in Haryana, may not be required to produce Resident Certificate, if they have passed the examination from a school/college situated in Haryana. For this purpose, a certificate of the Principal/ Headmaster from concerned institution where the children/wards studied last should be considered sufficient. The Principal/ Headmaster of the institution shall be competent to issue such certificate, which should be sufficient.

4. If a candidate is admitted on the basis of claim that he belongs to the State of Haryana but at any subsequent time is discovered that his claim was false, the student shall be removed from the institution, all fees and other dues paid up to the date of such removal shall be confiscated. The Principal/Headmaster may take such other action against the student and his/her parents/guardians as he may deem proper in the circumstances of any particular case.
5. The children/wards/dependents of the employees of Punjab & Haryana High Court, who are discharging their duties in connection with the affairs of the State of Haryana and have not availed facility from their parent State, the State of Punjab and U.T. Administration Chandigarh, would also be eligible for grant of Resident Certificate of the State of Haryana only for the purpose of admission in academic/technical/ medical institutions of the State of Haryana. However, in that case the employees of the Punjab & Haryana High Court shall be entitled to draw this benefit at one place/State only. Head of the Department of the Punjab & Haryana High Court would be competent to issue such a certificate.



The above mentioned Civil Appeal No. 2718/2020 (Arising out of SLP (C) No. 21429 of 2019) titled as Aryan Raj Vs. Chandigarh Administration and others Hon'ble Supreme Court of India in its order dated July 08, 2020 observed that Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes candidates are required to obtained 35% passing marks to pass in the aptitude test as against the requirement of 40% for general

candidates. The relaxed criteria of 35% pass marks in aptitude test shall apply to the candidates with disabilities also for admission.

The Hon'ble Supreme Court Directed all States/UTs to take up the matter with Department of Education, Culture, General Administration and other concerned department on the following aspects:-

- a. Adopt a uniform qualifying criteria for Persons with Benchmark Disabilities included the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016 candidates of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes categories for admission to various higher educational courses.
- b. Issue appropriate advisory to all Universities to develop courses suitable for Persons with Intellectual developmental, mental disabilities for their educational empowerment.
- c. Consider increasing such number of seats in the discipline of painting and applied art.



No. Leg.15/2020.—The following Act of the Legislature of the State of Haryana received the assent of the Governor of Haryana on the 25th March, 2020 and is hereby published for general information:-

HARYANA ACT NO. 14 OF 2020**THE HARYANA SCHEDULED CASTES (RESERVATION IN ADMISSION IN GOVERNMENT EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS) ACT, 2020****AN****ACT**

to provide for reservation in admission in Government educational institutions to persons belonging to the Scheduled Castes in the State of Haryana with special measures for deprived Scheduled Castes and for matters connected therewith or incidental thereto.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Haryana in the Seventy-first Year of the Republic of India as follows:-

1. This Act may be called the Haryana Scheduled Castes (Reservation in Admission in Government Educational Institutions) Act, 2020. Short title.
2. In this Act, unless the context otherwise requires,- Definitions.
 - (a) "Annexure" means the Annexure appended to this Act;
 - (b) "competent authority" means an officer appointed under section 5;
 - (c) "deprived Scheduled Castes" means such Scheduled Castes as specified in Annexure;
 - (d) "Government educational institution" means any higher education institution established and maintained by the Government or receiving aid out of the State funds, imparting education leading to the award of a degree including a post-graduate degree and shall include Government aided technical and professional institutions;
 - (e) "Government" means the Government of the State of Haryana in the administrative department;
 - (f) "prescribed" means prescribed by the rules;
 - (g) "Scheduled Castes" means Scheduled Castes notified under article 341 of the Constitution of India.
3.
 - (1) Twenty per cent seats shall be reserved for the members of the Scheduled Castes while making admission in Government educational institutions. Reservation.
 - (2) Fifty per cent of the twenty per cent seats reserved for Scheduled Castes for admission in any Government educational institution shall be set aside for candidates belonging to deprived Scheduled Castes as enumerated in the Annexure.
4. Where a seat set aside for candidate from deprived Scheduled Castes for admission in Government educational institutions is not filled up in any academic year due to non-availability of candidate of deprived Scheduled Castes possessing the requisite qualifications, the same shall be made available to candidate of Scheduled Castes. Seats not to be carried forward to next year.

- Competent authority to issue certificate.
5. (1) The Government may, by notification, appoint any officer as competent authority for the purposes of carrying out the provisions of this Act.
- (2) The competent authority shall, for the purposes of section 3, issue caste identification certificate specifying the caste name of the Scheduled Caste, in such manner, as may be prescribed.
- (3) The competent authority shall, for the purposes of this Act, exercise such powers and perform such functions, as may be prescribed.
- (4) The competent authority shall be deemed to be a public servant within the meaning of section 21 of the Indian Penal Code, 1860 (Central Act 45 of 1860).
- Certificate of identification.
6. A person belonging to the deprived Scheduled Castes shall, for the purposes of section 3, support his candidature by a certificate of caste identification issued by the competent authority under sub-section (2) of section 5.
- Protection of action taken in good faith.
7. No suit, prosecution or other legal proceedings shall lie against the competent authority, officers of the Government for anything which is in good faith done or intended to be done under this Act or any rule or order made thereunder.
- Power to remove difficulties.
8. If any difficulty arises in giving effect to the provisions of this Act, the Government may, by order, published in the Official Gazette, make such provisions not inconsistent with the provisions of this Act, as may appear to be necessary for removing the difficulty:
- Provided that no such order shall be made under this section after the expiry of three years from the commencement of this Act.
- Power to make rules.
9. (1) The Government shall, by notification in the Official Gazette, make rules for carrying out the purposes of this Act.
- (2) Every rule made under this Act shall, as soon as possible, after it is made, be laid before the State Legislature.
- Review of Annexure.
10. The Government may, on the basis of such criteria, as may be prescribed and on the expiration of ten years from the coming into force of this Act and at every succeeding period of five years thereafter, review the Scheduled Castes included in the Annexure.

In this Act under Section 3 and 6 following provisions have been made:-

Section 3. (1) Twenty per cent seats shall be reserved for the members of the Scheduled Castes while making admission in Government educational institutions.


(2) Fifty per cent of the twenty percent seats reserved for Scheduled Castes for admission in any government educational institution shall be set aside for candidates belonging to the Deprived Scheduled Caste as enumerated in the Annexure.

Section 6. A person belonging to the Deprived Scheduled Castes shall, for the purposes of section 3, support his candidature by a certificate of caste identification issued by the competent authority under sub-section (2) of section 5.

2. In this Act, 36 Castes were included in the list of Deprived Scheduled Castes at Annexure to this Act. For proper implementation of this Act, all the authorities competent to issue Caste Certificate are directed to mention clearly that the Certificate is of 'Deprived Scheduled Caste' or 'Scheduled Caste' so that at the time of admission the Institutions may find out easily as to how many candidates applied

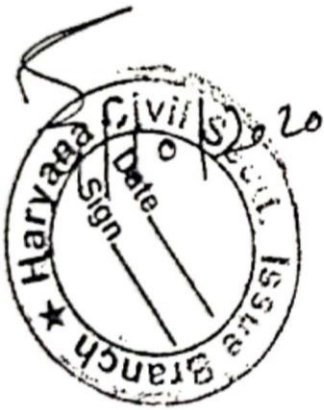
for admission and how many have been given admission under 'Deprived Scheduled Caste' category.

Sub: Exclusion of socially advanced persons/sections (Creamy Layer) from Backward Classes.

Sir,

I am directed to invite your attention to the subject mentioned above and to state that following the Supreme Court judgement in the Indira Sawhney and others versus Union of India case, the Haryana Government vide notification dated 12.10.1993 had set up the Haryana Second Backward Classes Commission. The terms of reference of this Commission were to entertain, examine and recommend upon requests for inclusion and complaints of over- inclusion and under-inclusion in the list of Backward Classes. Vide notification dated 26-5-1994, the Commission was also assigned the function of specifying the basis, applying the relevant and requisite socio-economic criteria to exclude socially advanced persons/sections (Creamy Layer) from Backward Classes.

In its report submitted on 16.5.1995, the Haryana Second Backward Classes Commission had recommended the criteria for excluding socially advanced persons/sections (Creamy Layer) from Backward Classes. After considering these recommendations, the Government has decided that the benefit of reservation shall not apply to persons/ sections mentioned in Annexure 'A', which is enclosed.

All the departments are requested to bring the above instructions to the notice of all the Heads of Departments and appointing authorities under their control for necessary compliance.

Description of Category To whom rule of exclusion will apply

I. Constitutional Posts Son(s) and daughter(s) of

- a) President of India;
- b) Vice President of India;
- c) Judges of the Supreme Court and of the High Courts;
- d) Chairman and Members of UPSC and of the State Public Service Commission; Chief Election Commissioner; Controller and Auditor General of India;
- e) Persons holding Constitutional positions of like nature.

II. Son(s) and daughter(s) of

- a) parents, both of whom are Class-I Officers;
- b) parents, either of whom is a Class-I Officer;
- c) parents, both of whom are Class-I Officers, but one of them dies or suffers permanent incapacitation.
- d) parents, either of whom is a Class-I Officer and such parent dies or suffers permanent incapacitation and before such death or such* incapacitation has had the benefit of employment in any International Organization like UN, IMF, World Bank, etc. for a period of not less than 5 years.
- e) parents, both of whom are Class-I Officers die or suffer permanent incapacitation and before such death or such incapacitation of the both, either of them has the benefit of employment in any International Organization like UN, IMF, World Bank, etc. for a period of not less than 5 years.

A. Provided that the rule of exclusion shall not apply in the following cases:

- a) Sons and daughters of parents either of whom or both of whom are Class-I Officers and such parent(s) dies/ die or suffer permanent incapacitation.
- b) A lady belonging to OBC category has got married to a Class-I Officer and may herself like to apply for a job.

B. Son(s) and daughter(s) of

- a) parents both of whom are Class-II Officers.
- b) parents of whom only the husband is a Class-I Officer and he gets into Class-I at the age of 40 or earlier.
- c) parents, both of whom are Class- II officers and one of them dies or suffers permanent incapacitation and either one of them has had the benefit of employment in any Inter-National Organization like UN, IMF, World Bank, etc. for a period of not less than 5 years before such death or permanent incapacitation;
- d) parents of whom the husband is a Class- I Officer (direct recruit or pre-forty promoted) and the wife is a Class-II officer and the wife dies or suffers permanent incapacitation; and
- e) parents, of whom the wife is a Class I officer (Direct Recruit or pre-forty promoted) and the husband is a Class-II officer & the husband dies or suffers permanent incapacitation. Provided that the rule of exclusion shall not apply in the following cases:

Sons and daughters of

- a) parents, both of whom are Class II officers and one of them dies or suffers permanent incapacitation.
- b) parents, both of whom are Class-II officers and both of them die or suffer permanent incapacitation, even though either of them has had the benefit of employment in any Inter-national Organisation like UN, IMF, World Bank, etc. for a period of not less than 5 years before their death or permanent incapacitation.

C. The criteria enumerated in A & B above in this Category will apply mutatis mutandi to officers holding equivalent or comparable posts in PSUs, Banks, Insurance Organizations, Universities, etc. pending the evaluation of the posts on equivalent or comparable basis in these institutions, the criteria specified in Category V below will apply to the officers in these Institutions.

III Sons(s) and daughter(s) of parents either or both of whom is or are in the rank of Colonel and above in the army and to equivalent posts in the Navy and the Air Force and the Para Military Forces:

Provided that -

- i) If the wife of an Armed Forces Officer is herself in the Armed Forces (i.e. the category under consideration), the rule of exclusion will apply only when she herself has reached the rank of Colonel;
- ii) the service ranks below Colonel of husband and wife shall not be clubbed together;
- iii) If the wife of an officer in the Armed Forces is in Civil employment, this will not be taken into account for applying the rule of exclusion unless she falls in the service category under item No. II in which case the criteria and conditions enumerated therein will apply to her independently.

IV Son(s) and daughter(s) of persons belonging to a family (father, mother and minor children) which owns land more than land permissible under the Ceiling Act of Haryana State.

V Income/Wealth Tax Son(s) and daughter(s) of:

- a) Persons having gross annual income of Rs. 4.50 lakhs or above or possessing wealth above the exemption limit as prescribed in the Wealth Tax Act for a period of three consecutive years. (Range of income has been revised from Rs. 2.50 lakhs to Rs. 4.50 lakhs vide Chief Secretary Letter No. 22/22/2004-3GS-III dated 22.01.2009).
- b) Persons in Categories I, II, III & IV who are not disentitled to the benefit of reservation but have income from other sources of wealth which will bring them within the income/wealth criteria mentioned in (a) above.

Explanation:

- i) Income from salaries or agricultural land shall not be clubbed;
- ii) The income criteria in terms of rupee will be modified taking into account the change in its value every three years. If the situation, however, so demands, the interregnum may be less.
- iii) Where the husband is in some profession and the wife is in a Class II or lower grade employment, the income/wealth test will apply only on the basis of the husband's income.
- iv) If the wife is in any profession and the husband is in employment in a Class II or lower rank post, then the income/wealth criterion will apply only on the basis of the wife's income and the husband's income will not be clubbed with it.

Explanation: Wherever the expression, 'permanent incapacitation' occurs in this schedule it shall mean incapacitation which results in putting an Officer out of service.

I am directed to invite your attention to the Govt. of Haryana, Social Welfare Department letter No. 1170-SW (1) 95, dated 7.6.95 on the subject noted above, therein criteria was laid down to assess the creamy layer persons of Haryana Backward Classes in Haryana State. The Backward Classes of Haryana are facing difficulty in obtaining the Backward Classes certificate from the certificate issuing authority due to some understanding in the instructions dated 7.6.95. After careful consideration the Govt. of Haryana has decided to issue clear cut directions to all the Heads of Departments and Deputy Commissioners in the state for issuing Backward Classes Certificate without any further delay.

It is clarified that the income from salary will not be taken into account for the purpose of income/wealth tax in respect of service category and while calculating income or wealth tax of the Government employee of Backward Classes who is not covered under Annexure-A, description of categories No. I, II (a,b,c,d) and III & IV, hence becoming entitled for the benefit of reservation under Backward Classes category, his salary should not be included but his other sources of income/wealth be included for income/wealth tax. All the departments are requested to bring the above instructions to the notice of all the Head of Departments and appointing authorities under their control for necessary compliance.

No. Leg.18/2016.— The following Act of the Legislature of the State of Haryana received the assent of the Governor of Haryana on the 1st April, 2016 and is hereby published for general information:-

HARYANA ACT NO. 15 OF 2016.**THE HARYANA BACKWARD CLASSES (RESERVATION IN SERVICES AND ADMISSION IN EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS) ACT, 2016.**

AN

ACT

To provide for reservation in services and admission in educational institutions to persons belonging to Backward Classes in the State of Haryana and for matters connected therewith or incidental thereto.

WHEREAS clause (4) of article 15 of the Constitution of India enables the State to make special provision for the advancement of any socially and educationally Backward Classes of citizens or for the Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes;

AND WHEREAS clause (5) of article 15 of the Constitution of India enables the State to make special provisions, by law, for the advancement of any socially and educationally Backward Classes of citizens or for the Scheduled Castes or Scheduled Tribes in so far as such special provisions relate to their admission to educational institutions including private aided educational institutions whether aided or unaided by the State, other than minority educational institutions referred to in clause (1) of article 30 of the Constitution;

AND WHEREAS clause (4) of article 16 of the Constitution enables the State to make any provision for the reservation of appointments or posts in favour of any Backward Classes of citizens which, in the opinion of the State, is not adequately represented in the services under the State;

AND WHEREAS clause (1) of article 38 of the Constitution provides that State shall strive to promote the welfare of the people by securing and protecting as effectively as it may a social order in which justice, social, economic and political, shall inform all the institutions of the national life;

AND WHEREAS clause (2) of article 38 of the Constitution provides that the State shall in particular strive to minimize the inequality in income, and endeavour to eliminate inequalities in status, facilities and opportunities, not only amongst individuals but also amongst groups of people residing in different areas or engaged in different vocations;

AND WHEREAS under article 46 of the Constitution, the State shall promote with special care, the educational and economic interest of the weaker sections of the people, and, in particular, of the Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes, and shall protect them from social injustice and all forms of exploitations;

AND WHEREAS the State of Haryana has decided to provide for reservation of seats in educational institutions including private educational institutions aided by the State;

AND WHEREAS the State of Haryana is of the opinion that the Backward Classes of citizens in the State are not adequately represented in the services under the State and therefore, it has been decided to provide for reservation of seats in appointments in the services under the State to Backward Classes.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Haryana in the Sixty-seventh Year of the Republic of India as follows:-

- Short title. 1. This Act may be called the Haryana Backward Classes (Reservation in Services and Admissions in Educational Institutions) Act, 2016.
- Definitions. 2. In this Act, unless the context otherwise requires,-
- “appointment” means an appointment by direct recruitment;
 - “Backward Classes” means such classes of citizens as specified in Schedule I, II or III;
 - “competent authority” means an officer or an authority authorised to make admission into educational institutions or appointment in services under the State or an authority empowered by the State under sections 8 and 9, as the case may be;
 - “creamy layer” means such class of persons within the Backward Classes as the State Government may, by notification in the Official Gazette specify for the purposes of this Act;
 - “educational institutions” means any institution imparting education, established and maintained by the Government, or receiving aid out of the State funds, and includes Government/Government Aided Technical and Professional Institutions;
 - “Government” means the Government of the State of Haryana;
 - “prescribed” means prescribed by the rules made under this Act;
 - “Schedule” means the Schedules appended to this Act; and
 - “services” means and includes the services under the Government, the Legislature of the State, any institution of Self Government, any local authority, any corporation or company owned or controlled by the State or any such other authority.
- Reservation in services. 3. While making appointment, reservation shall be made for the members of the Backward Classes as specified in the Schedule.
- Reservation in educational institutions. 4. While making admissions in educational institutions, reservation shall be made for the members of the Backward Classes as specified in the Schedule.
- Restrictions with regards to creamy layer. 5. (1) Notwithstanding anything contained in this Act, no person belonging to the creamy layer of Backward Classes shall be—
- considered for admission in educational institutions against the seats reserved therein for Backward Classes as specified in the Schedule; or
 - entitled to claim reservation in or be considered for appointment in services under the State against the posts reserved for Backward Classes as specified in the Schedule.
- (2) The Government shall, by notification, after taking into consideration social, economic and such other factors, as deemed appropriate, specify the criteria for exclusion and identification of persons belonging to the Backward Classes as creamy layer.
- (3) The criteria fixed under sub-section (2) shall be reviewed every three years.
- Horizontal reservation. 6. Notwithstanding anything contained in this Act, the State Government may provide for horizontal reservation for such category or categories of persons within Backward Classes, as it may deem necessary from time to time.
- Seats for admission not to be carried forward to next year. 7. Where the seats reserved for Backward Classes for admission in educational institutions are not filled up in any academic year due to non-availability of candidates possessing the requisite qualifications, the same shall, after the display of the final list of such admissions for that year, be made available to candidates of general categories by the educational institution.
- Competent authority to issue certificate. 8. (1) The Government may, by notification, appoint any officer to be the competent authority for the purposes of carrying out the provisions of this Act.
- (2) The competent authority may, for the purposes of sections 3 and 4, issue caste identification certificate in terms of Schedule in such manner, as may be prescribed.
- (3) The competent authority shall exercise such powers and perform such functions, as may be prescribed.
- (4) The competent authority shall be deemed to be a public servant within the meaning of section 21 of the Indian Penal Code, 1860 (45 of 1860).

- 9.** A person belonging to the Backward Class as specified in the Schedule shall, for the purposes of sections 3 and 4, support his candidature by a certificate of caste identification issued by the competent authority.
- 10.** No suit, prosecution or other legal proceeding shall lie against the competent authority, officers of the Government for anything which is in good faith done or intended to be done under this Act, or any rule or order made thereunder.
- 11.** If any difficulty arises in giving effect to the provisions of this Act, the State Government may, by order, published in the Official Gazette, make such provisions not inconsistent with the provisions of this Act as may appear to be necessary for removing the difficulty:
Provided that no such order shall be made under this section after the expiry of three years from the commencement of this Act.
- 12.** (1) The Government shall, by notification in the Official Gazette, make rules for carrying out the purposes of this Act.
(2) Every rule made under this Act shall, as soon as possible, after it is made or issued, be laid before the State Legislature.
- 13.** The Government shall at the expiration of ten years from the coming into force of this Act and at every succeeding period of ten years thereafter, undertake revision of the Schedule.
- 14.** The provisions of this Act shall have effect, notwithstanding anything inconsistent therewith contained in any other State law for the time being in force or any instrument having effect by virtue of any such law.
- 15.** Notwithstanding anything contained in any judgment, decree or order of any court or other authority, the reservation made, and anything done or any action taken on the basis of such reservation, by the Government for admission to educational institutions and for appointment in the services for the Backward Classes on the date of coming into force of this Act, shall, for all purposes be deemed to be and to have always been, validly made, done or taken in accordance with law, as if this Act had been in force at all material times when such reservation has been made and such thing done or action taken.

Sir/Madam,

I am directed to invite your kind attention towards Government Instructions No. 3870-WGI-ASOII-64/20069 dated 6th/9th October, 1964 whereby the candidates of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes provided 5% reduction in marks in the minimum eligibility qualification for admissions in various courses.



It has come to the notice of the Government that at present where a General Category candidate is required to have 50% marks in a prescribed qualification for admission in any course, as per the above instructions a reserve category candidate is required to have 45% marks giving him 5% reduction in the minimum qualification. Vide judgment of Hon'ble Supreme Court in Civil Appeal No. 7084/2011, it has been observed that the practice is wrong and the relaxation of 5% should be reduced from the minimum required marks on a general category candidate for e.g. :-

In a course, a general candidate requires to have 50% marks, than as per Govt. instructions by giving 5% relaxation the minimum eligibility marks for a reserved caste candidate should be calculated as under:-

- Out of 100 Marks needs to less = 5
- Out of 1 Marks needs to less = 5 / 100
- Out of 50 Marks needs to less = 5 / 100 X 50 = 2.50

This way minimum less marks where general category candidates are required to have 50% in a prescribed qualification, the total required marks for a reserved candidates will be $50 - 2.50 = 47.50$ and not 45.

All concerned are requested to implement the instructions as per the above procedure in the compliance of the judgment of Hon'ble Supreme Court passed in CWP No. 7084/2011.







Backward Classes of Haryana (A) (BCA)	16% of State Quota (13.6% of total intake)
Backward Classes of Haryana (B) (BCB)	11% of State Quota (9.35% of total intake)
Physically Handicapped (PH)	3% of State quota (2.55% of total intake).

Note: It is mandatory to maintain a Roster Register for distribution and reservation of seats.

In the event of quota reserved for Physically Handicapped remain unutilised due to non-availability for suitable category of Handicapped Candidates, it may be offered to the Ex- Servicemen and their wards (1%) and the dependents of Freedom Fighters (1%).

Further, 3% reservation is also provided to Ex-servicemen/ Freedom Fighters and their dependants by providing reservation within reservation of 1% of General Category, 1% out of Scheduled Caste and 1% from Backward Classes category for admission to the various educational institutions of the Govt. and Govt. aided / Institutes located in Haryana. As far as Block allocation in Block-A and Block-B of Backward Classes category is concerned year wise rotational system will be adopted. For example if Block-A of Backward Classes are given seats in academic year 2018, the next Block i.e., (B) Block of Category of Backward Classes will be given seats in the next academic year 2019 and so on. Further, a roster register for reservation of seats for ex-servicemen/freedom fighters shall be maintained and carry forward all fractions, till one seat is accumulated through different fractions over the years. As and when the total comes to one, a seat will be provided.

Fifty percent of the twenty percent seats reserved for Scheduled Castes for admission in any educational institution shall be set aside for candidates belonging to deprived Scheduled Castes as enumerated in the Appendix-I.

Where a seat is set aside for candidate from the deprived Scheduled Castes for admission in Government Educational Institution is not filled up in any academic year due to non-availability of candidate of the deprived Scheduled Castes possessing the requisite qualification, the same shall be made available to the candidate of Schedule Castes.

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GUIDELINES FOR RESERVATION

1. The reservation of seats is as per the Reservation Policy of Haryana Govt. and is subject to change/amendment made by the State Govt. from time to time.

2. Candidates belonging to SC/ST are required to submit a certificate from the competent authority as per **Appendix-A**. The list of Deprived Scheduled Castes notified by the Haryana Government, is available at **Appendix-I**.

3. Candidates belonging to Backward Classes are required to submit a certificate from the competent authority as per **Appendix-B**. The list of Backward Classes in Haryana notified by the Haryana Government is available at **Appendix-F**. Circular no. 1170-SW (1)-95 dated 7.6.95 of the Haryana Govt. for excluding Socially Advanced Persons/Sections (Creamy Layer) from Backward Classes may be referred to at **Appendix-G**.

4. The children or grand children (Maternal & Paternal) of Freedom Fighters are required to submit a certificate from the competent authority as per **Appendix-C**.

5. Only those candidates who have permanent disability of not less than 40% (being otherwise fit for admission to the program) will be considered for admission as Physically Handicapped. They will submit a certificate from the competent authority as per **Appendix-E**.

6. Children or Wards of Military Personnel (including personnel of Para-Military Forces killed in Action or Permanently Disabled in Action and Boarded Out from the Services or Ex- Servicemen and their wards will be considered for reservation. They will submit a certificate as per **Appendix-D**. The following categories of personnel of Territorial Army are included in the definition of Ex-Servicemen in terms of the State Govt. letter No. 12/18/2006-GS-II dated 8-01- 2008:

- i) Pension holders for continuous embodied service
- ii) Persons with disability attributable to military service
- iii) Gallantry Award Winners and

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iv) Such recruits boarded out/released on medical grounds and granted medical/ disability pension.

7. A candidate who applies for a reserved category or for both reserved and general categories will be considered first in general category. In case, he is not selected in general category, he will be considered for reserved category.

The Scheduled Castes/Backward Classes candidates who get selected /admitted in Educational/Professional/Technical Institutions and Universities in open competition on the basis of their own merit, will not be counted against the quota reserved for scheduled caste/ backward classes. rather they will be treated as open competition candidates. However, such candidates shall fulfill condition of eligibility regarding age etc. as are meant for general category candidates (Memo No.13864-75 dated 24.8.2012 received from the Principal Secretary to Govt. of Haryana, Welfare of Scheduled Caste and Backward Classes Department, Chandigarh).

8. If a candidate belongs to more than one reserved category, he/she shall be required to give his/her preference at the time of filling up the admission form. Preference once given shall not be changed.

9. If any seat remains vacant in sub-categories of BC (A) and BC (B), the same will be filled up through the candidates belonging to General Category. For example, if any seat in BC (B) category remains vacant, the same will be filled up from BC (A) category and vice-versa.

10. If any seat remains vacant in sub-categories of SC, the same will be filled up through the candidates belonging to other sub category of SC. For example, if any seat in SC category remains vacant, the same will be filled up from Deprived SC category and vice-versa.

10. Benefit of reservation will be given to all the reserved categories upto 2nd Merit List. In case if reserved seats other than SC seats are vacant even after 2nd Merit List, then these vacant seats will be thrown open to Haryana General Category. In case, the seats in Haryana General Category remain vacant at the end the same will be thrown open to All India Open Category.


Sir,

I am directed to invite your attention to the subject mentioned above and to state that following the Supreme Court judgment in the Indira Sawhney and others versus Union of India case, the Haryana Government vide notification dated 12.10.1993 had set up the Haryana Second Backward Classes Commission. The terms of reference of this Commission were to entertain, examine and recommend upon requests for inclusion and complaints of over-inclusion and under-inclusion in the list of Backward Classes. Vide notification dated 26-5-1994, the Commission was also assigned the function of specifying the basis, applying the relevant and requisite socio-economic criteria to exclude socially advanced persons/sections (Creamy Layer) from Backward Classes.

In its report submitted on 16.5.1995, the Haryana Second Backward Classes Commission had recommended the criteria for excluding socially advanced persons/sections (Creamy Layer) from Backward Classes. After considering these recommendations, the Government has decided that the benefit of reservation shall not apply to persons/sections mentioned in Appendix H which is enclosed.

All the departments are requested to bring the above instructions to the notice of all the Heads of Departments and appointing authorities under their control for necessary compliance.





- iii) Where the husband is in some profession and the wife is in a Class II or lower grade employment, the income/wealth test will apply only on the basis of the husband's income.
- iv) If the wife is in any profession and the husband is in employment in a Class II or lower rank post, then the income/wealth criterion will apply only on the basis of the wife's income and the husband's income will not be clubbed with it.

Explanation: Wherever the expression, 'permanent incapacitation' occurs in this schedule it shall mean incapacitation which results in putting an Officer out of service.



No. Leg.15/2020.—The following Act of the Legislature of the State of Haryana received the assent of the Governor of Haryana on the 25th March, 2020 and is hereby published for general information:-

HARYANA ACT NO. 14 OF 2020

THE HARYANA SCHEDULED CASTES (RESERVATION IN ADMISSION IN GOVERNMENT EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS) ACT, 2020

AN
ACT

to provide for reservation in admission in Government educational institutions to persons belonging to the Scheduled Castes in the State of Haryana with special measures for deprived Scheduled Castes and for matters connected therewith or incidental thereto.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Haryana in the Seventy-first Year of the Republic of India as follows:-

1. This Act may be called the Haryana Scheduled Castes (Reservation in Admission in Government Educational Institutions) Act, 2020. Short title.
2. In this Act, unless the context otherwise requires,- Definitions.
 - (a) "Annexure" means the Annexure appended to this Act;
 - (b) "competent authority" means an officer appointed under section 5;
 - (c) "deprived Scheduled Castes" means such Scheduled Castes as specified in Annexure;
 - (d) "Government educational institution" means any higher education institution established and maintained by the Government or receiving aid out of the State funds, imparting education leading to the award of a degree including a post-graduate degree and shall include Government aided technical and professional institutions;
 - (e) "Government" means the Government of the State of Haryana in the administrative department;
 - (f) "prescribed" means prescribed by the rules;
 - (g) "Scheduled Castes" means Scheduled Castes notified under article 341 of the Constitution of India.
3.
 - (1) Twenty per cent seats shall be reserved for the members of the Scheduled Castes while making admission in Government educational institutions. Reservation.
 - (2) Fifty per cent of the twenty per cent seats reserved for Scheduled Castes for admission in any Government educational institution shall be set aside for candidates belonging to deprived Scheduled Castes as enumerated in the Annexure.
4. Where a seat set aside for candidate from deprived Scheduled Castes for admission in Government educational institutions is not filled up in any academic year due to non-availability of candidate of deprived Scheduled Castes possessing the requisite qualifications, the same shall be made available to candidate of Scheduled Castes. Seats not to be carried forward to next year.

- Competent authority to issue certificate.
5. (1) The Government may, by notification, appoint any officer as competent authority for the purposes of carrying out the provisions of this Act.
- (2) The competent authority shall, for the purposes of section 3, issue caste identification certificate specifying the caste name of the Scheduled Caste, in such manner, as may be prescribed.
- (3) The competent authority shall, for the purposes of this Act, exercise such powers and perform such functions, as may be prescribed.
- (4) The competent authority shall be deemed to be a public servant within the meaning of section 21 of the Indian Penal Code, 1860 (Central Act 45 of 1860).
- Certificate of identification.
6. A person belonging to the deprived Scheduled Castes shall, for the purposes of section 3, support his candidature by a certificate of caste identification issued by the competent authority under sub-section (2) of section 5.
- Protection of action taken in good faith.
7. No suit, prosecution or other legal proceedings shall lie against the competent authority, officers of the Government for anything which is in good faith done or intended to be done under this Act or any rule or order made thereunder.
- Power to remove difficulties.
8. If any difficulty arises in giving effect to the provisions of this Act, the Government may, by order, published in the Official Gazette, make such provisions not inconsistent with the provisions of this Act, as may appear to be necessary for removing the difficulty:
- Provided that no such order shall be made under this section after the expiry of three years from the commencement of this Act.
- Power to make rules.
9. (1) The Government shall, by notification in the Official Gazette, make rules for carrying out the purposes of this Act.
- (2) Every rule made under this Act shall, as soon as possible, after it is made, be laid before the State Legislature.
- Review of Annexure.
10. The Government may, on the basis of such criteria, as may be prescribed and on the expiration of ten years from the coming into force of this Act and at every succeeding period of five years thereafter, review the Scheduled Castes included in the Annexure.

Copy of letter No. 1170-SW (I)-95 dated 7.6.95 received from the Commissioner & Secretary to Government, Haryana, Welfare of Scheduled Castes and Backward Classes Department, Haryana, Chandigarh, addressed to all Heads of Departments, Commissioners, Ambala, Hisar, Rohtak and Gurgaon Divisions, all Deputy Commissioners & Sub Divisional Officers in Haryana and Registrar, Punjab and Haryana High Court, Chandigarh.

Sub: Exclusion of socially advanced persons/sections (Creamy Layer) from Backward Classes.

Sir,

I am directed to invite your attention to the subject mentioned above and to state that following the Supreme Court judgement in the Indira Sawhney and others versus Union of India case, the Haryana Government vide notification dated 12.10.1993 had set up the Haryana Second Backward Classes Commission. The terms of reference of this Commission were to entertain, examine and recommend upon requests for inclusion and complaints of over- inclusion and under-inclusion in the list of Backward Classes. Vide notification dated 26-5-1994, the Commission was also assigned the function of specifying the basis, applying the relevant and requisite socio-economic criteria to exclude socially advanced persons/sections (Creamy Layer) from Backward Classes.

In its report submitted on 16.5.1995, the Haryana Second Backward Classes Commission had recommended the criteria for excluding socially advanced persons/sections (Creamy Layer) from Backward Classes. After considering these recommendations, the Government has decided that the benefit of reservation shall not apply to persons/ sections mentioned in Annexure 'A', which is enclosed.

All the departments are requested to bring the above instructions to the notice of all the Heads of Departments and appointing authorities under their control for necessary compliance.

ANNEXURE-A

Description of Category To whom rule of exclusion will apply

I. Constitutional Posts Son(s) and daughter(s) of

- a) President of India;
- b) Vice President of India;
- c) Judges of the Supreme Court and of the High Courts;
- d) Chairman and Members of UPSC and of the State Public Service Commission; Chief Election Commissioner; Controller and Auditor General of India;
- e) Persons holding Constitutional positions of like nature.

II. Son(s) and daughter(s) of

- a) parents, both of whom are Class-I Officers;
- b) parents, either of whom is a Class-I Officer;
- c) parents, both of whom are Class-I Officers, but one of them dies or suffers permanent incapacitation.
- d) parents, either of whom is a Class-I Officer and such parent dies or suffers permanent incapacitation and before such death or such* incapacitation has had the benefit of employment in any International Organization like UN, IMF, World Bank, etc. for a period of not less than 5 years.
- e) parents, both of whom are Class-I Officers die or suffer permanent incapacitation and before such death or such incapacitation of the both, either of them has the benefit of employment in any International Organization like UN, IMF, World Bank, etc. for a period of not less than 5 years.

A. Provided that the rule of exclusion shall not apply in the following cases:

- a) Sons and daughters of parents either of whom or both of whom are Class-I Officers and such parent(s) dies/ die or suffer permanent incapacitation.
- b) A lady belonging to OBC category has got married to a Class-I Officer and may herself like to apply for a job.

B. Son(s) and daughter(s) of

- a) parents both of whom are Class-II Officers.
- b) parents of whom only the husband is a Class-I Officer and he gets into Class-I at the age of 40 or earlier.
- c) parents, both of whom are Class- II officers and one of them dies or suffers permanent incapacitation and either one of them has had the benefit of employment in any Inter-National Organization like UN, IMF, World Bank, etc. for a period of not less than 5 years before such death or permanent incapacitation;
- d) parents of whom the husband is a Class- I Officer (direct recruit or pre-forty promoted) and the wife is a Class-II officer and the wife dies or suffers permanent incapacitation; and

- e) parents, of whom the wife is a Class I officer (Direct Recruit or pre-forty promoted) and the husband is a Class-II officer & the husband dies or suffers permanent incapacitation. Provided that the rule of exclusion shall not apply in the following cases:

Sons and daughters of

- a) parents, both of whom are Class I officers and one of them dies or suffers permanent incapacitation.
b) parents, both of whom are Class-II officers and both of them die or suffer permanent incapacitation, even though either of them has had the benefit of employment in any International Organisation like UN, IMF, World Bank, etc. for a period of not less than 5 years before their death or permanent incapacitation.

C. The criteria enumerated in A & B above in this Category will apply mutatis mutandi to officers holding equivalent or comparable posts in PSUs, Banks, Insurance Organizations, Universities, etc. pending the evaluation of the posts on equivalent or comparable basis in these institutions, the criteria specified in Category V below will apply to the officers in these Institutions.

III Sons(s) and daughter(s) of parents either or both of whom is or are in the rank of Colonel and above in the army and to equivalent posts in the Navy and the Air Force and the Para Military Forces:

Provided that -

- i) If the wife of an Armed Forces Officer is herself in the Armed Forces (i.e. the category under consideration), the rule of exclusion will apply only when she herself has reached the rank of Colonel;
ii) the service ranks below Colonel of husband and wife shall not be clubbed together;
iii) If the wife of an officer in the Armed Forces is in Civil employment, this will not be taken into account for applying the rule of exclusion unless she falls in the service category under item No. II in which case the criteria and conditions enumerated therein will apply to her independently.

IV Son(s) and daughter(s) of persons belonging to a family (father, mother and minor children) which owns land more than land permissible under the Ceiling Act of Haryana State.

V Income/Wealth Tax Son(s) and daughter(s) of:

- a) Persons having gross annual income of Rs. 4.50 lakhs or above or possessing wealth above the exemption limit as prescribed in the Wealth Tax Act for a period of three consecutive years. (Range of income has been revised from Rs. 2.50 lakhs to Rs. 4.50 lakhs vide Chief Secretary Letter No. 22/22/2004-3GS-III dated 22.01.2009).
b) Persons in Categories I, II, III & IV who are not disentitled to the benefit of reservation but have income from other sources of wealth which will bring them within the income/wealth criteria mentioned in (a) above.

Explanation:

- i) Income from salaries or agricultural land shall not be clubbed;
ii) The income criteria in terms of rupee will be modified taking into account the change in its value every three years. If the situation, however, so demands, the interregnum may be less.
iii) Where the husband is in some profession and the wife is in a Class II or lower grade employment, the income/wealth test will apply only on the basis of the husband's income.
iv) If the wife is in any profession and the husband is in employment in a Class II or lower rank post, then the income/wealth criterion will apply only on the basis of the wife's income and the husband's income will not be clubbed with it.

Explanation: Wherever the expression, 'permanent incapacitation' occurs in this schedule it shall mean incapacitation which results in putting an Officer out of service.

Subject: Clarification regarding issuance of certificate of Haryana Backward Classes.

Sir,

I am directed to invite your attention to the Govt. of Haryana, Social Welfare Department letter No. 1170-SW (1) 95, dated 7.6.95 on the subject noted above, therein criteria was laid down to assess the creamy layer persons of Haryana Backward Classes in Haryana State. The Backward Classes of Haryana are facing difficulty in obtaining the Backward Classes certificate from the certificate issuing authority due to some understanding in the instructions dated 7.6.95. After careful consideration the Govt. of Haryana has decided to issue clear cut directions to all the Heads of Departments and Deputy Commissioners in the state for issuing Backward Classes Certificate without any further delay.

It is clarified that the income from salary will not be taken into account for the purpose of income/wealth tax in respect of service category and while calculating income or wealth tax of the Government employee of Backward Classes who is not covered under Annexure-A, description of categories No. I, II (a,b,c,d) and III & IV, hence becoming entitled for the benefit of reservation under Backward Classes category, his salary should not be included but his other sources of income/wealth be included for income/wealth tax. All the departments are requested to bring the above instructions to the notice of all the Head of Departments and appointing authorities under their control for necessary compliance.

Subject: Regarding prescribing minimum eligibility qualification for the various courses.

Sir/Madam,

I am directed to invite your kind attention towards Government Instructions No. 3870-WGI-ASOll-64/20069 dated 6th/9th October, 1964 whereby the candidates of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes provided 5% reduction in marks in the minimum eligibility qualification for admissions in various courses.

It has come to the notice of the Government that at present where a General Category candidate is required to have 50% marks in a prescribed qualification for admission in any course, as per the above instructions a reserve category candidate is required to have 45% marks giving him 5% reduction in the minimum qualification. Vide judgment of Hon'ble Supreme Court in Civil Appeal No. 7084/2011, it has been observed that the practice is wrong and the relaxation of 5% should be reduced from the minimum required marks on a general category candidate for e.g. :-

In a course, a general candidate requires to have 50% marks, than as per Govt. instructions by giving 5% relaxation the minimum eligibility marks for a reserved caste candidate should be calculated as under:-

Out of 100 Marks needs to less = 5

Out of 1 Marks needs to less = 5 / 100

Out of 50 Marks needs to less = 5 / 100 X 50 = 2.50

This way minimum less marks where general category candidates are required to have 50% in a prescribed qualification, the total required marks for a reserved candidates will be $50 - 2.50 = 47.50$ and not 45.

All concerned are requested to implement the instructions as per the above procedure in the compliance of the judgment of Hon'ble Supreme Court passed in CWP No. 7084/2011.

NOTE ON RESERVATION POLICY

The Reservation Policy in the Haryana State has been reviewed from time to time i.e. 09.02.1979, 20.07.1995, 15.07.2014, 13.07.2017, 25.02.2019, 30.04.2019, 01.05.2019 and 27.01.2020, 14.03.2023 and After Enactment of Haryana Backward Classes (**Reservation in Services and Admission in Educational Institutions**) Act, 2016. Beside this, the State Govt. has also issued instructions to grant reservation while engaging contractual employees under Part-I and Part-II of the outsourcing policy vide Chief Secretary Instruction dated 27.10.2017 and 12.03.2018. At present, the quantum of reservation fixed for Scheduled Castes, Backward Classes (Block A, B, and C), Economically Weaker Section, Physically Handicapped, Ex-serviceman and Eligible Sports Persons in the services of Govt. Departments, Public Sector Undertaking and Universities etc. in the Haryana State are as under:-
